In a sense we celebrate something new every time we gather for the sacred mysteries. The old is quite literally cast off and the new imparted in the sacrament of Jesus' Body and Blood. There are so many glamorous distractions and far too many dysfunctions which tend to make us discount God's very real presence in the world around us.

Several decades ago St. Paul VI warned that an increasingly secularized culture would bring about massive wounds in the human condition and we can see them all around us. Here in Toledo as all around our nation, the homicide rate escalates because there is no thought of the value of another person's life. All around the world there are civil wars and dissension, including right here in the United States. While Paul called for an increase in involvement in the Church for Catholics to best address these ills and woes, the culture itself pulls people away to do some gusto grabbing or cave in to despair.

As you drive into Lima from the north along I-75, you'll see a big sign on the US Plastics building: Christ is the answer. And he is. But the answer he gives requires you and me and all other faithful members of his mystical body to boldly celebrate who we are and for what we stand. We cannot bring into play the answer of Jesus unless we are actively involved, excitedly joined to the praying community and willing to go out into the marketplace (that's what the Church calls the world where we live, play and work) to live the life to which we have been called by Baptism and strengthened by the Eucharist.

So, if you're making a few New Year's resolutions, why not make one to be a part of Bible Study this year? How about pledging to tune in to FORMED at least once every week? Maybe resolve to attend Wednesday evening Mass every week in addition to our Sunday celebration? Sign on to one of the parish ministries and get involved, live up to the challenge of 2500 bishops gathered at II Vatican Council who wanted everyone to be part of the leadership. Become a new you in this new year.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
