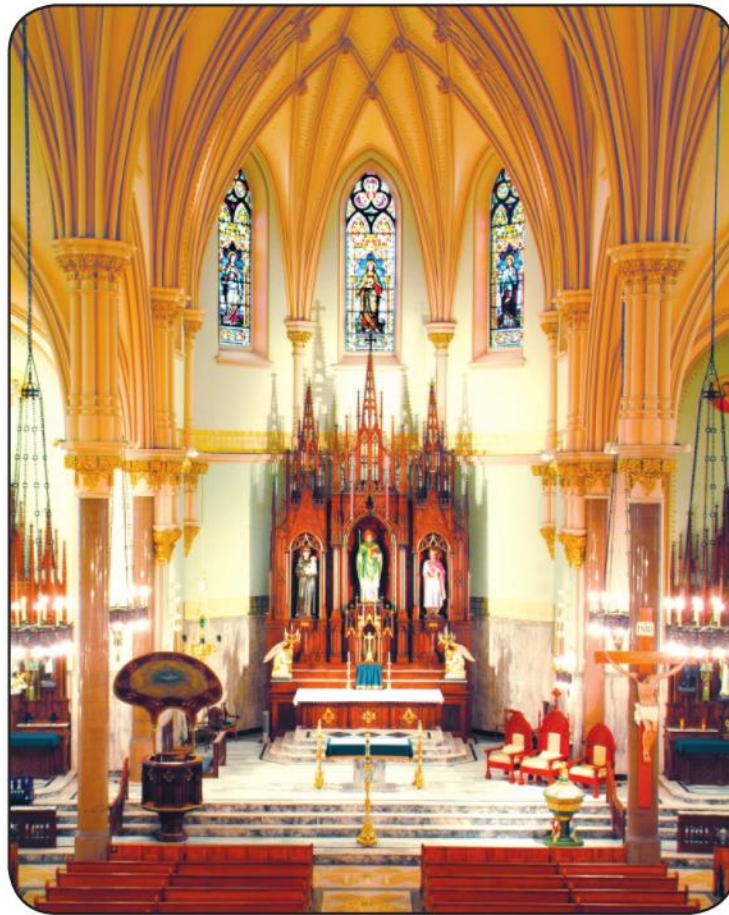

**"Today this scripture passage
is fulfilled in your hearing."**

Luke 4:21

Dear People of God,

In response to a question I had regarding the seriousness of sin, I thought I'd do a series on the seven deadly sins. This will also address a perennial issue raised by people in the pew that we don't talk enough about sin.

Let me begin by saying a few things about sin in general: what it is, why it's dangerous and only then move on to those seven big ones. Sin is the deliberate destruction of the relationship between the person and God and may well involve destroying relationships between people or between the sinner and human institutions (the church, workplace, family, etc.)

Deliberated. This word means that we know what we're doing; we know we shouldn't do what we are considering but we do it anyway. This leads to the two general categories of sin: mortal (the seven big ones we'll get to eventually) and venial, the smaller and less damaging actions we take or omit which break down relationships but don't totally destroy them. Our deliberations have to do with knowing the good and its alternative, the bad, and actually *choosing* the bad over the good for some arcane reason. Made in the image and likeness of God, all humans are equipped by being human to know what is the good. We all have an interior inclination to do the good and usually do just that so rarely sin. Ah, but then comes temptation, some alluring alternative which is thrown into the mix of our thoughts and which leads us to consider the alternative to the good. Why do we choose what isn't good?

There are a lot of reasons or motivations for choosing the sinful rather than the good. I suspect for most of us that the primary reason is convenience: it's just easier in the here and now to take the low road rather than the high one that accomplishes the good. For example, little Susie comes in the kitchen door and, wow, Mom's been baking cookies. The aroma creates the temptation to snatch one or two or a dozen if we can get away with it. What do we do? If the cookie jar is right there on the counter where it's easy to grab a few and make a quick getaway, temptation bows to convenience and we've managed to steal a handful. If the cookie jar is on an upper shelf where we'd need to find a step tool to reach it, we'll likely take a pass and choose the good by taking that pass.

Another all too common motivation for doing what isn't good is habituation. That means that once we commit some minor not-good, the second time is a lot easier and thus we develop a bad habit, especially if the action is enhanced by the exhilaration of not getting caught. Unfortunately, one cookie today becomes two and then five and then a dozen and what began as a simple sinful act of stealing that doesn't harm anyone becomes a major sin when we decide we can steal the entire cookie jar and the entire family is angry with us when we finally do get caught.

A little simple but I hope you get the idea: convenience and habituation are stepping stones to sin. Our goal is to choose a different path, the one whose outcome is that which is good.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

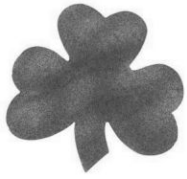

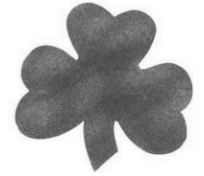
