




Dear People of God,

We're working our way into the Seven Deadly Sins and today we'll focus on one of them. As those of you who have been to the rectory at HSP know, there are depictions of the Sins on the wall of the grand staircase as envisioned by a well-known local artist. I'll include them as we wander into the Seven Deadly Sins beginning with **Sloth**.

Sloth is sometimes equated with laziness and for the most part, that's an agreeable word to use. However, think of the animal from whom this deposition gets its name and you'll see that it isn't exactly laziness; it's a whole lot more and has to do with slowing down everything we do so we're out of sync with the rest of humanity. At work we're expected to do a fair day's labor for a fair day's pay, but Sloth leads us to do less while being content to take more. At home we're expected to participate in family work, recreation and support, but Sloth intervenes to lead us to head for our own room and do little to enhance family life. Spiritually we're expected to fully and actively participate. At Church that means lifting the hymnal and actually singing. It means volunteering for a Ministry and it also means extending hospitality to others. Sadly, once again Sloth rears its guilt-worn face and leads us to simply sit and do little more than that. In the end, Sloth gets us so far behind everybody else that we're isolated and alone.

Because humans don't enjoy being alone, the slothful person begins to show signs of premature aging as you can see so wonderfully depicted by the artist. Worry lines, bags under the eyes, no hint of a smile - there is a sadness involved: when Sloth takes hold and becomes a truly deadly sin, the relationships we ought to enjoy in family, at work, during recreation and at Church decay and die because others resent our slowness and leave us behind. This can lead to other and far more serious sins, including despondency and despair i.e. that sense that we're in a pretty deep rut and there's no way out.



Of course, there's always a way out, but where Sloth has become a bad habit it's difficult and lengthy and Sloth has a tendency to make us think we can't manage it. But we can and, as the plastics factory in Lima proclaims to passersby, "Christ is the answer."

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





Mental Health Myths and Facts

Myth: Mental health problems don't affect me.

Fact: Mental health problems are actually very common. In 2014, about:

- One in five American adults experienced a mental health issue
- One in 10 young people experienced a period of major depression
- One in 25 Americans lived with a serious mental illness, such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, or major depression

Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States. It accounts for the loss of more than 41,000 American lives each year, more than double the number of lives lost to homicide.

Whenever a County/City within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a *Level 3 Snow Emergency*

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

Annual Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking

The Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and the International Union of Superiors General has designated February 8 as an annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking. February 8 is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, who was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery in Sudan and Italy. Once Josephine was freed, she became a Canossian nun and dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery and comforting the poor and suffering. She was declared a Saint in 2000.

On February 8, Catholics all over the world are encouraged to host or attend prayer services to create greater awareness about this phenomenon. Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity, but also comfort, strengthen, and help empower survivors.
