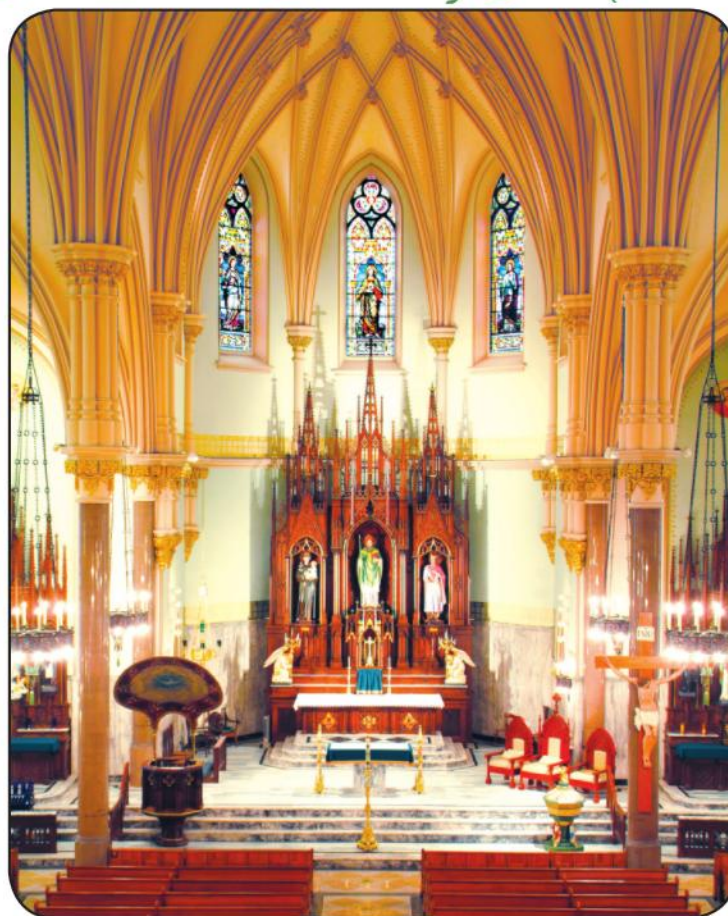

Dear People of God

Lent begins this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, with the customary imposition of ashes as a sign of humility and our need for God in our lives. The forty days are a period of self-reflection and penance for our faults, failings and sins. We might all want to consider going the extra mile this season to reinvigorate our faith and the obligation we have to God for the love revealed in Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection.

We could configure our Lenten reflections around the programming available on FORMED. I've been told some of the older parishioners don't want to use their computer, tablet or phone for FORMED, as if it were going to infect them with some dread disease. Whatever the reason, whether it is patent nonsense or merely a poor excuse for avoiding learning something new about the Church, FORMED offers all of us an enrichment opportunity. None of us should wallow in ignorance of our faith and our church so get on FORMED and make regular use of it during Lent as an act of penance (doing something good to make up for the bad things we do) or as a good work (the extra things we take on to make life better for ourselves and others). Getting onto the FORMED platform is easy: instructions are in today's bulletin. There is absolutely no excuse for anyone or any family not making use of the service during these forty days. It may be the perfect way to transform your observance of Lent into a newly meaningful forty days.

We might want to consider fasting in a different light by skipping things that prevent us being with others in a healthy way. Are you addicted to your phone and can't put it down for a minute to carry on a real conversation with somebody?

When Betty White hosted SNL, she mentioned that everybody seemed consumed by Facebook and admitted she had never used Facebook but had looked into it for the show. Her conclusion? "It seems a pretty big waste of time." Are you wasting your time and that of others as well by posting things that have little real meaning? Why not post forty days of good works or forty days of one-line prayers for your followers?

Abstinence means we don't eat meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. Many of us support worthy charities by heading out to a fish fry those days (I hope that's our motive); consider instead going the extra mile by planning a regular menu for those few days and adding up the cost of the meat from which you and the family are abstaining and offering that amount to the food pantry. Your abstinence then takes on new meaning in the lives of others who may well be abstaining every day of the week.

Lent is a time of prayer so why not go beyond reading a few rote prayers and get into Bible study. The Word of God is the best prayer there is because it's God talking to us. When we discuss the Word with others, we're actually talking to God. A conversation ensues which enriches us all.

With Lent on the horizon, today maybe the ideal time to plan ahead with ways that will lead to a satisfying and joyous Easter.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

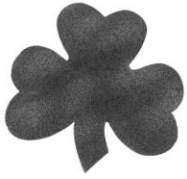

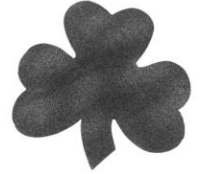

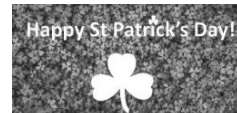
