

Dear People of God,

We're coming to the end of the Seven Deadly Sins trail; only three more to go and today's entry is **Gluttony**, the sin of overindulging in food and drink.

Gluttony isn't just eating a little too much or a little too well; it's doing it to the extent that we harm others by depriving them of what we take. From the image here, it would seem that gluttony focuses on too much self-love to the exclusion of the sharing we're supposed to be doing with others, especially with the material goods which sustain life itself.

In a sense, the glutton is a hoarder but doesn't want to do the hoarding in a pantry, refrigerator or freezer but has a strange desire to hoard it all inside. Since what goes in goes out in large part the next day, there's an end-

less cycle of shoving things into the forward end before somebody else can grab it and enjoy it. Because the glutton isn't careful about what (s)he shoves in, gluttony often has adverse health consequences. The real sin of gluttony isn't eating too much or drinking too much; it's the failure to love others enough to make sure they can enjoy the very things we enjoy. That means the sinful glutton may well be

as thin as the proverbial rail, but when it comes to sparing a few items from the pantry for the needs of the poor and hungry, the glutton will find excuses to offer nothing at all or some worthless, stale can of bread crumbs left over from three or four years ago, a useless offering given the common practice of "Use by" dating which requires food pantries to dispose of outdated "gifts." We might think of this as selfishness taken to the nth degree. Real selfishness does little to enhance getting along with the people around us.

The glutton destroys relationships to assure the flow of goods to him or her and this leads to social isolation with all of the ensuing negative results. The glutton pictured here may look happy but deep within, he isn't.





The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




