

Dear People of God,

We've come to the end of the list of the Seven Deadly Sins: **Lust**. This one is an inordinate fascination with or engagement in the things of the body.

All of us come equipped with a physical self and that self has some features necessary for the reproduction of the species and survival of the human race. Ordinarily we exercise those faculties from the aspect of love, be it the love of spouses or the love of parents begetting children. In a word, we act responsibly. Lust, on the other hand, is the gravely irresponsible use of the body to fulfill a lack of real self-love and a genuine lack of real love for the others with whom we indulge our cravings.

Lust consumes the lustful sinner, resulting in actions founded on either the desire for or engagement in those well-known sins of the flesh. The desire or engagement becomes the underlying "reason" for life and leads to neglecting the other and equally important aspects of getting along in a community. Our work becomes sloppy or we might even not show up.



Our family suffers our absence from everyday events and activities. We increasingly hide our desires and engagement because deep within we know they are wrong and destructive. Unfortunately, sins of the flesh will more easily than almost anything else form habitual behaviors; many of those associated with the use of the reproductive aspects of the human body are not easily broken and some cannot be broken at all. Bad habits which entail lust are among the deadliest social habits in existence and more laws have been written to attempt to curtail them than in any other area of human behavior.

Back in the 80's a Presidential Commission suggested that these habits tend to lead to unfulfilled expectations (because they are socially isolating) and once we get into these sorts of sins, they take on a darker and darker aspect just because they do not bring about the tranquility and contentment of a shared love relationship.

There you have it, the Seven Deadly Sins.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
