
Dear People of God,

Beannachtaí na Cásca oraibh go léir ó bhur sagart agus ón bhfoireann! Our Irish roots are showing as we awaken to another magnificent Easter Sunday morning. Regardless of the weather, the day must always be beautiful for it is the triumphant day of the Resurrection, the completion of the Paschal Mystery begun last Sunday with the ceremony of the palms. We should all give thanks to the Lord whose love is revealed in the events we've noted these last few days, especially for the gift of the Eucharist we've come to share. In a more practical sense, thanks go out as well to everyone who helped make these days of joy and happiness a beautiful experience for all who attended.

Scripture scholars are always intrigued by the actual historical date of Christ's Resurrection. We know it was a Sunday but which one? Which calendar date was the real date? Because the calendar date moves, the early Church fixed the celebration on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. That means according to the calendar and the phases of the moon, it can occur in late March all the way to late April. Most of us grew up accustomed to that novel means of setting the date for Easter, but for many who are considered tense experts at the Bible, the actual day Jesus rose is important. Calculating dates is complicated.

You might think we need only go back to the Hebrew calendar and find out when Passover was in the year 33; however, we're not sure that's the right year since there's no clear evidence for just when Jesus was born according to the ancient calendars in use during his life time. If we take into account the real names mentioned in the birth narratives, we don't get an exact date but do get a range which has the year 4BC as the most likely year he was born according to the Julian Calendar in use back then. That still doesn't help much because we're not sure how well that was accepted by the Hebrews who, like us, had their own liturgical calendar to keep the holy days. We know that Passover was a spring holiday celebrated in the Jewish month God said should always be the first but doesn't bother to mention what historic day it began. We know it lasted seven days and Jesus died on one of the final days of the celebration, the day after the sharing of the paschal lamb, supposedly the day the Hebrews began their exodus from Egypt. Even given these details, we're actually no closer to an historical date than when we started.

However, for those interested, scholarship has gone well beyond the considerations listed above and has come up with a possible and very likely day for Jesus' death on the Cross: April 9, 27 AD, which would put that first Easter on April 11. Curiously, the Passover was supposed to be celebrated in the first month of the Hebrew year and in Jesus time, April was the first month of the Roman (world) calendar. Coincidence? Or history? May God bless you this day and always in the risen Lord Jesus.



The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






