

Dear People of God,

I am currently in Ireland with a fellow group of parishioners on a trip long-delayed by covid. As I experience the pleasures of such a vacation, I also travel with the concerns of the parish and my prayers for the parishioners as an inevitable part of each day. It is one of these concerns that prompts a review of a previous bulletin letter and answers to some questions which were not clearly addressed.

Several weeks ago I used my weekly bulletin letter as a venue for focusing on the parish budget process, especially as it is a part of the diocesan budget process. This is the time of year when we must file a financial report with the diocese. Part of my goal was to shed light on the difficulty of conjecturing about income and expenses when, unlike most households, we do not have a committed income stream and the current inflationary spiral has seriously handicapped our expense projections just as it has yours. At that time, the bulletin included a Commitment card asking that you estimate your regular contributions for the coming year either as a weekly, monthly or yearly gift. To assist you, the card included figures for various income levels (\$15,000 to \$100,000) with 3-5% commitments listed. The card also invited you to consider an increase in your gifts via percentages based on your current contributions.

The cards did not specify any deadline nor any method of return. Naturally, you understand the need for the information as soon as possible so that we can provide accurate projections to the diocese by **July 2022**. Dropping these into the collection basket is an easy method of returning them. An alternative is to send an email to the office at [trish@stpatshistoric.org](mailto:trish@stpatshistoric.org) with your name, address and envelope #. If you are making your gifts electronically, please alert us to that fact so that we can record the amount in our system. We are not sure that this approach will be satisfactory enough to address our challenges but we are optimistic about the typical positive responses of our members as you consider your financial abilities and goals in helping us meet ours.

Since I am touring the Emerald Isle when you read this and since my concern for our parish and my prayers for all of you are traveling with me, expressing my appreciation for your cooperation and support in Gaelic seems fitting: Go raibh maith agat!

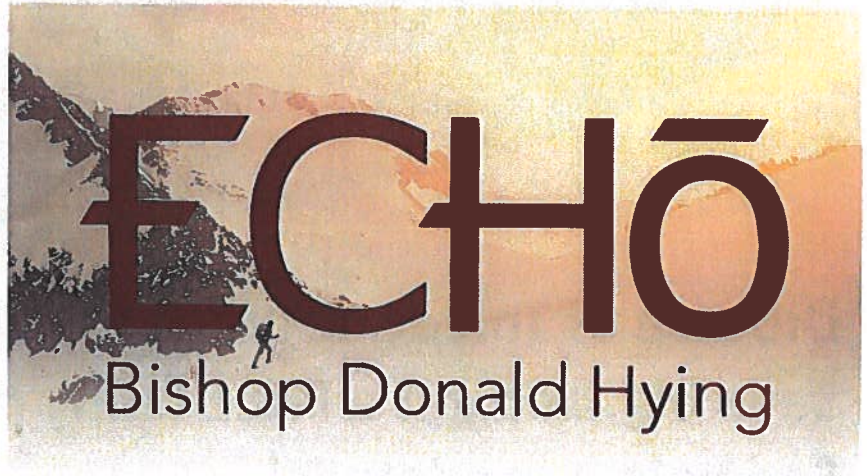

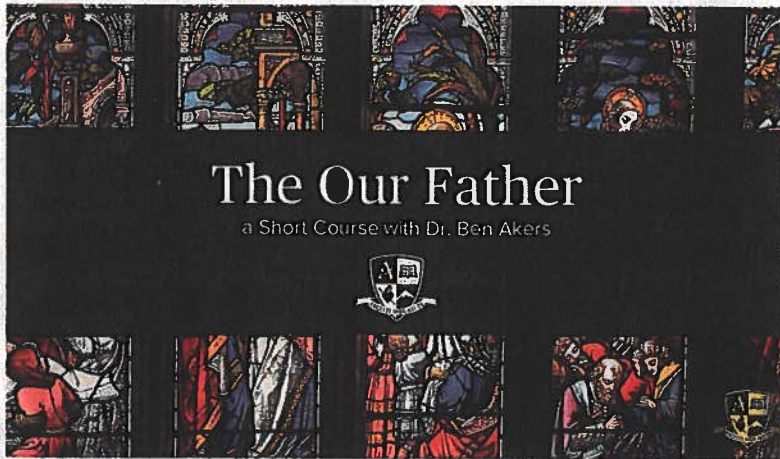

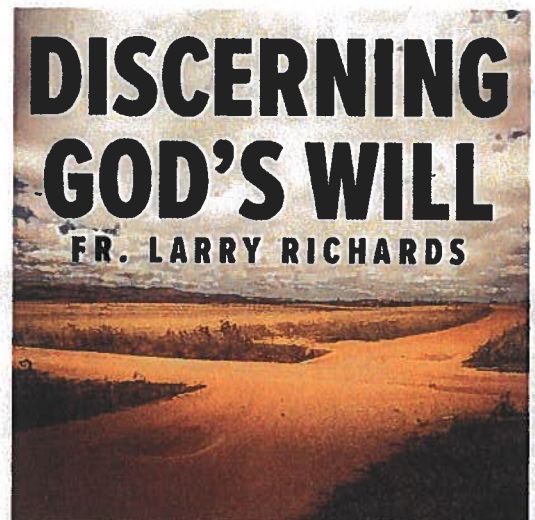
