

Dear People of God,

Last week I began a look at Evangelization, usually thought of as the formal sharing of the Good News to which each of us should be dedicated if we mean what we claim when we confess to be authentic Christians. Today I want to expand on one aspect of that command. In the Easter readings during the Octave of Easter, the Church focuses on the gospel of Luke and the apparition of Jesus to the disciples on their way to Emmaus and then to the gathered Apostles and others in the Upper Room. This is where Luke introduces Jesus' orders to the faithful to go out and proclaim the good news. The line I want to look at more closely is "beginning first at Jerusalem." (You can find the entire text in Luke's gospel chapter 24:36-49 – Luke repeats this command again at the beginning of Acts 1:7-9)

The great missionary command to teach all nations should be the underlying business of each one of us; however, if we look where it's all supposed to begin and keep in mind that names in Luke's gospel and Acts are there to convey meaning, then we should translate Jerusalem so that it has a contemporary reference. Yes, Jerusalem is a city in Israel and that's where the Apostles were at the time of the Ascension so the growth of the Church did begin as Jesus commanded at Jerusalem. However, in English the place it all starts is The City of Peace. Where is that city of peace today? Could it be Kyiv where a terrible war is raging? How about Axum, the ancient capital of Ethiopia in war-torn Tigray District where the Coptic monks claim the Ark of the Covenant is hidden away in a chapel? (Given that the chapel has not been destroyed by decades of war, maybe it is there.) How about contemporary Jerusalem where Palestinians and Israelies seem involved in an eternal struggle that has led to far too many killings in recent weeks? Could it be Moscow where dissidents are arrested and jailed on a daily basis? Or perhaps we might look at Rangon, Myanmar, except there's ethnic cleansing of the Rohingya there.

Where is the City of Peace? Closer to home? Columbia, South Carolina, where a mall became unsafe? New York, where going to work on the subway could lead to death? Is it Toledo where gun violence has claimed numerous lives, including a drive-by murder of an innocent child just a few feet from the front door of our Mother Church?

If we are to take on the challenge of Jesus to evangelize, we must begin by creating around us a City of Peace, a true Jerusalem where the Good News can flourish to the point of overflowing into the world beyond. That cannot happen unless each one of us is actively involved in some meaningful way. Isolating ourselves in our homes or here at church will never be the answer and will never be pleasing to the God we worship who asks that we love one another as he loves us.

What can be done to create a City of Peace? Start at home. What needs to happen in your house to make it a seedbed for real, genuine Christ-founded peace? (Remember that the Great Command suggests we must first love ourselves if we intend to love our neighbor.) Attend some of those meetings proposed by the city, county and various churches to address the issues of violence, be it with a gun or the domestic violence that plagues families and community. Look for ways to assist in addressing drug use and it abuse. Be aware of the signs of depression and know where to refer sufferers. Be aware of opportunities to make our world, your world, closer to being the City of Peace.

There's a well-known cliché that applies here: "If not now, when; if not us, who?"

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




