Dear People of God

As you read this, I will be flying home from a wonderful several weeks with the people of Ireland. I was away on a trip that ought to have occurred three years ago before we ever heard of something called the Coronavirus. What an amazing three years it's been. The virus closed down the church; we are still prayerfully waiting for many of our beloved family to return to the worship space to be part of our local Body of Christ giving due praise and glory to the God who chose to save us. Over that span we've also seen great acts of violence done here in our nation. be it the violence done at the hands of mobs, rioters, mentally ill teens shooting school children and, sadly, the terrible homicide rate here in Toledo and all around us. We've seen the horror of war, be it the Russian unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, the insurgency in Syria and Libya, the ongoing strife in the Sudan, the Tigray confrontations in Ethiopia, the apparent genocide of the Uighurs and others in China or the disastrous number of killings by the cartels in Mexico and South America.

Truly, we must beseech Heaven for an answer to these and other issues facing us today, for if we have learned nothing else, it is that we cannot resolve these things on our own without some divine intervention; at the same time, we must keep in mind that we cannot simply stand back and wait for God to cure the manifold ills of humanity: we must be willing to work with God to be the solution. Prayer must lead to action inspired by the Holy Spirit so that it is rooted in love, not revenge or any other similar pursuit. We can begin at home by doing our best to make the family dwelling a place of peace, avoiding coarseness and vilification in favor of kindness and compassion. I don't know about you, but I hurt in the heart when I hear the way families speak to one another, as if they were deadly enemies instead of bone of my bone and flesh of my flesh. While in Ireland I hope to visit the birthplace of Father Patrick Peyton at Attymass, County Mayo, and there commit myself and my parishes to a renewal of his ministry. I'll insert just one line from the Wikipedia page that tells it all:

Peyton popularized the phrases "<u>The family that</u> prays together stays together" and "A world at prayer is a world at peace."

I believe that we should all be people of prayer outside the doors of the church and that spiritual commitment should begin at home. I know many families are off and going all the time, so why not pray together in the car on the way to dinner or the theater or delivering the kids to Saturday morning soccer? Peyton believed that families should pray the rosary together – we did as kids until we got old enough to be involved in activities away from home – and I know from history that the rosary is, as the Church has often said, the most powerful weapon in our spiritual arsenal. Pray, but then go out and do.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



The HSP Soup Kitchen




