Dear People of God,

Because of bulletin deadlines and the need to have these letters submitted well in advance, I'm often out of sync with what's happening in the world. When possible, I try to interrupt the prepared letters with something topical; however, more often than not I miss and have to play catch-up later. Thus, I want to belatedly comment on the recent

consecration of Earl Fernandes as the Bishop of Columbus and in doing so, answer a question I got shortly after it was announced that he was to be made a bishop: How are bishops chosen?

Essentially, they are men who have done something to draw them to the attention of others in their diocese in a positive way. They are well-known and respected. Many have already come to the attention of Rome where the ultimate decisions are always made. However, the process begins locally with a questionnaire sent by the bishop once every three years to a random selection of Catholic parishioners seeking their input naming those they might know who fit the above parameters. They generally are asked to submit three names. The returned names are assembled into a package

from which every few years the bishop sends on the names of several good candidates to the regional Archbishop, in our case Cincinnati. He then periodically goes through the list and sends on the best qualified to the Papal Nuncio in Washington where several candidates are then vetted and their names sent to people who should know them for a personal recommendation. Those who get good marks from ordinary people in the Church are sent on to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome. When a vacancy occurs, the Congregation submits a list of qualified candidates to the pope who makes the final call.



Of course, all of this has a certain inherent political aspect to it because at each stage, the one doing the choosing from the overall list would normally be looking for (a) somebody he knows (b)who he believes will act in a similar way. Thus, the progressive selector will usually select a progressive and the traditionalist a traditionalist.

There's nothing wrong with that; we all like people who are like us and would do our best to see that they succeed.

Bishop Fernandes no doubt got preferential treatment because (1) the people of Cincinnati like him a lot, (2) the bishop of Cincinnati can trust him a lot, (3) the nuncio knows him personally because Bishop Earl worked for him for a few years. In other words, those who do the selecting know he fits the criteria I mentioned up above and believe he will be an able shepherd to his people because he's already shown that's what he does. A recent Sunday Blade featured a lengthy article about Bishop

Fernandes, his family, his local and clerical history and his priestly service, all of which documented key factors and personal qual-

ities which make him an admirable selection for his new role. In addition, his Toledo roots inspire a particular warm spot in our recognition of him and an appreciation for his acknowledgement of that warmth as recently reflected in his return to celebrate mass on June 12 in our beautiful cathedral.

Congratulations Toledo native Earl K. Fernandes. May God bless you and the people of Columbus.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


