I often wonder where we as Americans have gone wrong: in a nation with such vast wealth as ours, why is there so much poverty? Before the Pandemic our Outreach was kept busy with a fair number of families, far more than we ought to have in this city. The Pandemic drove up numbers as people were locked out of work for long periods of time; however, despite the easing of restrictions, we have seen not a decrease in numbers but instead, a slow and steady increase. Yes, inflation has driven many more families to the edge so that they must rely on the generosity and kindness of our Outreach and that of many others in our Zip Code. I certainly want to thank everyone who has helped keep up with the demand by generous donations of goods, cash and volunteer time at the pantry. Your thoughtfulness has enabled us to easily meet the needs of those who come to us for assistance.

Every now and then we post in the Bulletin some items or class of items we need at the moment, but you can always stop by and ask at the Outreach or call the office to find out if we have a special need. We can always use so-called toiletries, toothpaste, deodorant, hand lotion, soap and even laundry detergent, toilet paper and paper towels. These are not readily available through the food banks in our area so your thoughtfulness would be greatly appreciated.

We're seeing a lot more homeless stopping by. Pantry shelves otherwise filled with goods are often not what the homeless can use. Certainly, we keep them in bread and peanut butter and there are always plenty of sweets; however, the homeless cannot open and prepare things which require a stove or even a can opener, and it's these things that are far healthier than bread and peanut butter and a sugary donut. As your kindness directs you along the shelves of the grocery store, consider looking for things that do not need to be cooked and can be easily opened and accessed.

There is a regular food donation Sunday (the first one of the month.) Thus, next Sunday, Sept. 4, is an opportunity for you to bring your generous offerings; however, you can drop things off any time at the office or the Pantry when it's open. May God reward your generosity from his own abundant generosity.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

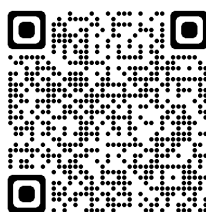
