Dear people of God,

I'm often told I don't preach enough on certain subjects, the supposed "good old topics." Examples include comments like these: "The Church never talks about sin anymore." "Why don't we hear more about the Right to Life?" "What ever happened to hell?"

The problem is that the homily has to be about the readings. I'm always amazed at watching television evangelists who will read something from Scripture and then preach on some other text. It happens at Sunday services too: a preacher will read from the common lectionary (the same readings we use which follow a schematic to give us exposure to the entire New Testament and complimentary Old Testament readings) but then take up some other text on which to preach. In Catholic preaching we're not supposed to do that – the Church gives us a sequential series of readings which form a pattern or common insight into God's love and that's what we're expected to preach on.

The texts for Sundays don't often coincide with events or celebrations going on around us; because the texts are in sequence, beginning with the early chapters of a gospel and moving on toward the latter chapters, they don't cherry pick topics for the homily. Rather, the homily should give us two distinct points to ponder throughout the week: (1) the overall themes of the gospel should stand out behind the weekly lection. Remember, there are three gospels featured in the Sunday cycle: Matthew in Cycle A, Mark in Cycle B and Luke in Cycle C with John being inserted here and there for some specific event.

The themes give us an overall message revealed in the four gospels: Jesus alone dies on the cross (Mark); fulfilling all of the Old testament prophesies (Matthew) and beginning a new Covenant in Christ (Luke) because God loves us (John). (2) We ought to hear some specific insight on today's world.

In the era of Bishop Altar (1939-1950), he wrote all the homilies and sent them to the priests who then preached the same thing in every parish so that the teaching of the Bishop would be proclaimed everywhere. Today we're on our own with some occasional input on ideas for homilies from the Bishop. Each priest is supposed to be aware of the gospel's thematic foundation and then focus on that theme from the Sunday Gospel using the other two readings to amplify the message. If any of those "good old" topics is in the reading, then it gets preached, but most of the time none of them are there so the homily will be on some other important topic the Gospels themselves believe we ought to hear.

Very often the topics we used to hear are proclaimed in the daily readings which is why we have daily Mass which we urge people to attend. We are also fortunate to have access to FORMED and to a small library in the back of the church for those who wish to pursue their interest in neglected topics either to expand their knowledge, nurture their faith formation, or inspire their meditation.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




