Dear People of God,

On a regular basis I tend to work one or another of two basic Catholic beliefs into my homily – either the Real Presence of Jesus in all seven of the sacraments but most especially the Eucharist, or I'll wave over at the crucifix as a reminder that the crucifixion of Jesus is a core belief of the Catholic Church: he died on the cross as a sign of God's love so we could be saved from ourselves. Apparently this led someone to examine the crucifix more closely and that led to a question: What do the letters INRI stand for since *inri* isn't a common English word?

They are the letters of the four-word phrase Pontius Pilate had tacked to the cross on which Jesus was crucified. It was the ordinary practice to indicate why somebody was being punished on the cross so onlookers would be warned not to commit that particular behavior. It might say "Robbery" or "Murder" or some other simple term everybody would understand. In Jesus' case it should have been "Sedition" or "Treason" since that's what the Sanhedrin accused him of in order to invoke Roman Law and get him on the cross. If that had been the case, the sign above him bluow read have either Seditio or Proditio but neither of those was on the cross. Rather, Pilate, the Governor of Roman Palestine, demanded that the phrase Jesus of Naza*reth. King of the Jews* be posted and in no less than three languages: Latin, Hebrew and Greek. Why three?

The answer lay in the law and the conquered people. The legal language of the Empire in that period was Greek so an official decree of death had to be in Greek. Few "people on the street" knew Greek so it was also there in Latin, the unofficial language of the Empire like English is of the world today. This would have made the criminality well known to the thousands of foreign visitors in Jerusalem for Passover. Finally, because the case had been referred to Pilate by the Sanhedrin, the Jewish religious government, Pilate had the same phrase posted in Hebrew which, like Latin today, was the official but rarely publicly used language of the Jewish Church. Most Palestinians of that era spoke Aramaic. Jesus was probably fluent in all three and perhaps a couple of others since Jerusalem was the biggest city on a very busy trade route from Africa to Asia and Europe. So here they are, the three phrases Pilate had painted on a sign above Jesus:

Latin: Iesus Nazarenus, Rex Iudaeorum

Greek: Αυτός είναι ο Ιησούς ο βασιλιάς των Εβραίων

Hebrew: ישו מנצרת, מלך היהודים

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




