Dear People of God,

Since Covid it seems that time truly flies; here we are already on the verge of October, the month of the Rosary. Given this October focus, I thought I'd do a brief tour of the twenty mysteries of the rosary over the next couple of weeks. Yes, that's right: there are twenty mysteries of the rosary since Pope St. John Paul II added five Luminous Mysteries. I'll get to them eventually but first I'd like to address what the rosary is and how it ought to be prayed since I suspect many (perhaps most) of us are doing it all wrong.

The rosary properly prayed is a meditative exercise in which the vocalized words, repetitive and simple, distract us from the world around us so we can inwardly give serious thought to the mystery being contemplated. That means that despite being drawn from Sacred Scripture, the Our Father, Hail Mary and the early Church's statement of faith, the Glory Be, are not the focus of the rosary. Those prayers are certainly important but they are a means of attaining something far more sublime: the mystery itself.

We should know that each of the mysteries leads us to the partnership between God and each of us as individuals and all of us as the community of faith. Thus, as we allow the words to remove our attention from the world around us, we can begin to consider the all-important function of each of the mysteries. Our first thought ought to be "Why did God do it that way?" That should lead us to a few other thoughtful questions our contemplation begins to resolve: What aspect of the human condition is made holy or sacred by God's participation in it as a purely human activity? How should that affect my behavior toward myself and others, especially the Church as the Body of Christ? What difference did this particular participation by Jesus make in the world of his time? How does that reflect on Jesus' participation in the world in which I live? Each of the twenty mysteries is an opportunity to open our minds, hearts and souls to God's Word but only if we pray the rosary the right way. Sure, repeating the words is helpful but doing so does not offer the same interaction between each of us and our loving God.

The mysteries are grouped in sets of five delineated by the underlying thought mode we ought to bring to that particular set. Why should our joy be expanded by the Joyful Mysteries? What is illuminated for us by the Luminous Mysteries? What genuine sorrow should be evoked by each of the Sorrowful Mysteries? What promise of future glory for me or for the parish or for the world is revealed by the Glorious Mysteries?

Real meditation can make huge changes in our lives and that of the Church. In the past when a Rosary Crusade was launched by the Universal Church, genuine effects in the course of history were recorded and that could happen again. However, it takes a lot of effort to pray the rosary as it was meant to be prayed, using our mind to bring into sharp focus an event from two thousand years ago and make it come alive for us in the contemporary world. So, as October rushes up on us, give the real rosary a try during the weeks of the Month of the Rosary.



The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




