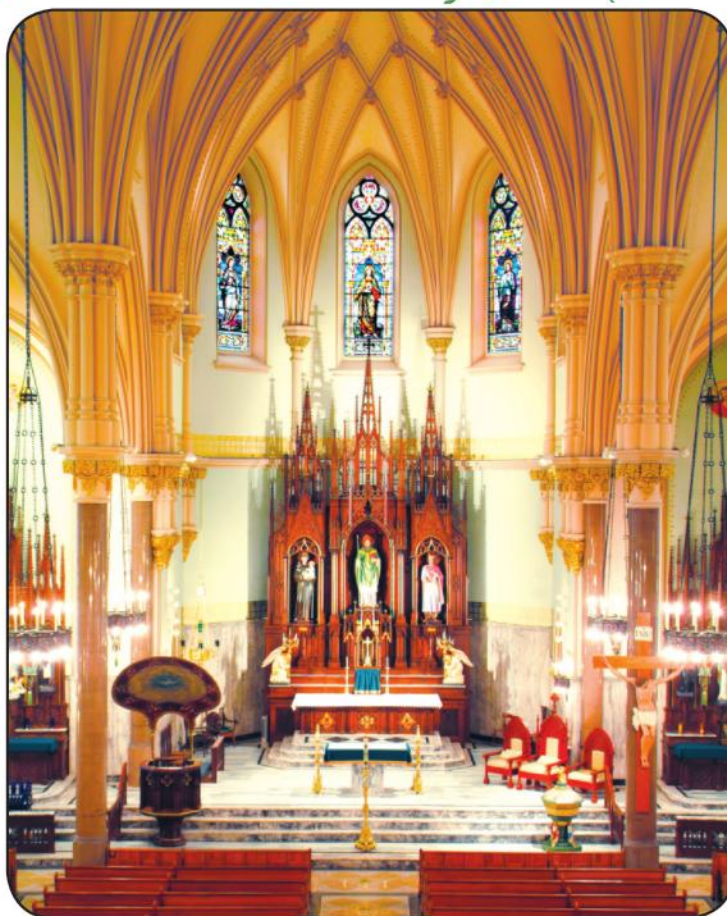

Dear People of God,

Over the past few weeks I've been discussing the mysteries of the rosary from a more human stance as a way to help us dive into the meditation they are meant to rouse in us as we repeat the vocal prayers. Today we'll wind up the series by taking a look at the Glorious Mysteries, those moments of triumph and wonder that cap Jesus' Mission and Ministry with events that are both ordinary and extraordinary because they touch on the end times and what awaits us when all things are brought under the Kingship of Jesus. Here they are:

The Resurrection – Jesus rises from the dead. While we may think this is an extraordinary event and only looks forward to something we'll achieve a million years from now, there is an aspect to it that hearkens to ordinary human existence. Consider all the times we think we've hit the end of the road, perhaps as simple as solving today's crossword puzzle or Sudoku or as monumental as figuring out how to come up with the theory of relativity. We humans are always rising from what seems the end to discover new devices to ease our lives, new drugs to cure old ailments, new technologies and today, with our space mounted telescopes, new worlds.

The Ascension – Christ's return to heaven is certainly a promise of our own return to the Kingdom where we will be with our God. However, think of all the times we, too, return to a familiar and beloved place. I was recently at one of the parishes where I was stationed at the beginning of my priestly life and it was like going home. Yes, things have changed and it's not what I envisioned, but neither is heaven which will be unlike anything we can imagine.

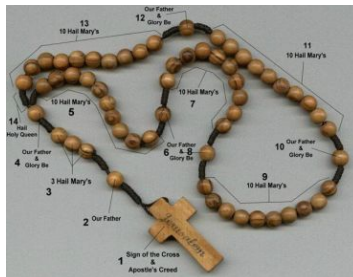
The Descent of the Holy Spirit – Did you ever have an "Ah, Ha!" Moment when, as if by some intellectual enlightenment, you knew something you didn't know seconds before? I imagine that's how the Apostles and Mary felt when the Spirit enlightened them to the fullness of truth about Jesus and Salvation.

The Assumption – Well, we've finally come to one that's truly extraordinary. Humanity dies and decays: "from dust to dust." But the great promise of all of the mysteries of Jesus' life shared with us is the future reality of our own life fully shared with Jesus, not as disembodied spirits but as fully alive, fully bodied human beings. Mary was given that gift ahead of time to thank her for her obedience to the will of God as God's very Mother. She is the example of what will one day be ours.

The Coronation of Mary – Great to think about but way beyond what will be ours in heaven. Jesus thanks his Mother for her part in our salvation by marking her out as the "first among equals," the exemplar of what humanity was originally intended to be. However, we ought not think that's the end of the story. Consider the underlying meaning here: Jesus lifts up humanity and that's you and me. Jesus gives high places in heaven to ordinary people and that's you and me. These are truly glorious things to consider as we contemplate this particular mystery.

October is the month of the Rosary: Whatever mysteries you incorporate into your recitation of the rosary, pray it as it was meant to be prayed.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
