

Dear people of God,

November is the time to think of all the saints and all those we hope have made it to the saintliness of heaven. An interesting fact of human civilization dating back to the Neanderthal (400,000 to about 40,000 years ago and probably much farther back than that) is an awareness of life beyond death, the existence of a place where there is no more weeping, no more death, only happiness and contentment. More recently we can visit the tombs and temples of ancient civilizations from Egypt to Asia to South America and view the powerful monuments to those whom people felt had died to this world but had gone to another. We needn't go that far to appreciate that we, too, have this same deeply rooted sense of life beyond death: it's called the cemetery.

On the other hand, we can actually study all of those other cultures because they left writing for us to decode; furthermore, it is more than likely that all those who never developed writing weren't sure just how that mechanism of change and eternal life functioned. Because death seemed so final, there was no sure way to know who made it and who didn't because the notion of heaven and hell also seems to be a universal bit of inborn knowledge. To counteract fear of hell, there was and still remains hope. As St. Paul reminds us, hope is the belief in what we cannot know. I trust that my folks, my sister and brother are in heaven because that's what a loving God asks me to believe. God created us to be with him so my hope lies in that promise for all who have gone before me and for me one day as well.

Hope for our deceased brothers and sisters is a constant reminder that there is a goal at the end of this life and that we must, as St. Paul wrote to Timothy, run the race and compete well in order to cross the finish line and enter into the glory of God. Those who have died become for us fondly recalled role models so we can bake like Grandma, farm like Uncle Joe, paint like Aunt Muriel, build a birdhouse like Dad and aspire to all of those wonderful things our loved-ones accomplished while among us.

Take time during this month to visit the cemetery, pay your respects to the memory of those you know, and perhaps wonder about the lives of a few whom you never met. Our hope is that all who rest in peace will one day rise up to eternal life. Keep in mind as well those of our parish who have lost loved ones this year and say a prayer that they will be consoled by the hope that is a gift from God.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

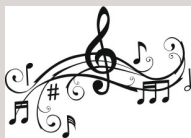

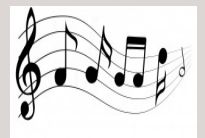

The HSP Soup Kitchen



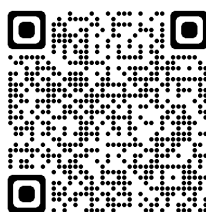

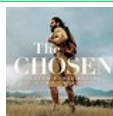
