Dear People of God,

Today begins a period of true holy days. For many they have become holidays; however, for we Catholic Christians they are holy. Christmas begins "in time" the historical reality of salvation, our salvation. The birth of Christ, promised of ages, brings to earth the very creator of the earth. We remind ourselves that Jesus is God, the God of love, compassion, mercy and salvation. Cheapening that event into a few days off from work is a serious mistake for without the holiness unleashed in that moment when the new born first cried out is to stymie the work he came to do for those who so easily forget the message of salvation.

Yes, Christmas is a time for celebration and certainly can make use of the snow, the crisp cold nights, the crystal clear air, the jingling of sleigh bells (think of all the millions who have never heard them on a real sleigh – have you? I believe you can down in Fremont at the Hayes Estate during the holidays), tinsel and trees and even fruitcake; however, if we forget to bring Jesus into the picture, we've failed in our Christianity.

As a parish steeped in its Irish roots, do you know the Irish Christmas traditions which focus clearly on Jesus? The most important is the Midnight Mass. We have one which begins at midnight with a few minutes or so of caroling (which is another Irish custom although we ought to do it out on the front steps to be legitimately Irish about it). Midnight Mass is the one at which the actual birth narrative is proclaimed. Yes, I know many parishes have wrongly introduced those readings at the so-called "Children's Mass, which should be reserved for children and their immediate families, not just those who want to sleep in Christmas morning.

Merry Christmas

Christmas is on Sunday and that creates a real problem for the bookkeeper in the parish who is counting on a Sunday envelope as well as a Christmas envelope. I recall from my childhood listening to Monsignor Clancy (the only pastor I ever knew while in Swanton) ask everyone to consider making a Christmas gift of ten times the ordinary Sunday offering. Paying the bills was just as difficult back then as it is today so I do ask that everyone consider something for both that Sunday collection and the Christmas one as well. Since it is possible that the impact of Christmas falling on a Sunday did not register with many of us, Christmas or regular Sunday contributions (depending on whatever envelope you already used) would be more than welcome anytime this week by Dec 31 for your donations to be tax deductible if relevant for you. Yes, I know all about how hard inflation has hit you and your family because it has hit the parish just as hard and we rely on your kindness because I haven't' as yet figured out how you buy the right lottery ticket so we could solve the financial problems forever!

Have a joyous holy day today and always. May the Christ we honor and adore bless you with only good in the days to come.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school

events in that geographic region are

also cancelled.
