Dear People of God,

A special welcome to our guest presider, Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend. 160 years ago his predecessor, John Henry Luers, laid the cornerstone of the first church and then returned for the first Mass celebrated in the completed church. That first towering church overlooked the Miami and Erie Canal where thousands of Irish immigrants toiled first to create the waterway and then to serve along its wharves and guays. Because the bishop of Cleveland had ordered Fr. Hannin to build the church nearly a mile to the west, the cornerstone laying and dedication Mass were held without that bishop's presence. Although many of the founder's contacts and friends from the secular world joined Catholic, Protestant, and Jewish friends in attendance at those two events, most of the large crowds consisted of the Irish and today the parish remains a distinct and proud Irish destination parish.

On the walls of the Sanctuary one can see today the Irish colors, yet few know the story behind them. Fifteen years before the foundation of Toledo's St. Patrick parish, on 7 March, 1848, in Waterford County. a group of young Irishmen, inspired by the revolutions occurring on the mainland of Europe, raised the call to arms in an attempt to wrest Ireland form English control. Twenty-five-year-old Thomas Francis Meagher, one of those who hoped to see a free and independent Ireland, hoisted the tricolor flag to rally the rebels. It remained aloft for eight days before the English captured the place and tore it down. He would later describe it:

"The white in the center signifies a lasting truce between the orange and the green," he said, "and I trust that beneath its folds, the hands of the Irish Protestant and the Irish Catholic may be clasped in generous and heroic brotherhood." While the rebellion failed, the tricolor triumphed and became the national flag of the Irish Republic. One hopes that its intentional summons to religious understanding and cooperation will continue to bear fruit not only for the people of the Emerald Isle but for all of humankind.

Meagher, like many Irish caught up in the independence struggle, was arrested and condemned to death as a traitor. His sentence was commuted to imprisonment in Tasmania; however, he escaped and in 1852 made his way to the United States. He enlisted in the Army and rose to the rank of Brigadier General and Territorial Governor of Montana. He died a patriot of both Ireland and the United States in 1867, just a few years after the parish in Toledo was established.

We honor today people like Thomas Meagher who understood the human yearning for independence and liberty. We honor as well all those who in this day and age seek that same simple gift of real freedom.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
