



Dear People of God,

As Lent begins, the diocese once again launches the Annual Catholic Appeal. Several people have asked why the goals of the ACA seem similar to the goals of our recently completed phase of the *Living Christ Campaign*. I thought I'd take a bit of time to answer that question.

Living Christ seeks to raise \$65,000,000. Most of that would be invested in endowments which will, once the funds are fully raised, earn interest adequate to meeting many of the ordinary ministries of the diocese. However, there is a five year pay down period before that goal of sixty-five million will be met so the endowed funds are going to grow slowly over those five years.

On the other hand, the ACA seeks to provide immediate access to the funds necessary to operate the existing ministries of the diocese. ACA dollars are directed to what the diocese does to enhance and perform the works of Jesus. They are not operating funds; rather they provide for the common ministerial needs of the nineteen county Diocese. Operating funds are derived from other income streams, largely the Diocesan Assessment each parish offers to the diocese.

ACA pays the costs of seminary for the young men all of us hope will one day be ordained for the parishes. We can't wait five years for an endowment to cover those costs because the seminaries expect to be paid now, just as any of us expects to be paid now for the work we're doing. Assisting our teachers with ongoing formation is another essential area which can't wait – we want our teaching staff to be the best we can provide for our children. Catholic Charities provides services all across the diocese right now and the ACA helps to fund those services for thousands of clients.

It's the same for other ministries which count on the generosity of the people in the pew to keep those ministries fiscally healthy and able to do their work. We're all asked to consider making a pledge to the ACA. Some can offer a lot, others a little and everyone can offer prayer. Each Friday I offer Mass at the Pastoral Center and I'm always sure to look through some of the petitions people have sent in and make them my intention for the day.

In the end, working together provides the means to accomplish far more than any single parish could on its own. It's a good reminder that we all belong to a bigger Church than our local parish and have a responsibility toward that larger Church just as we do to our own parish. Please consider what you can do. A dollar from the poorest is the same as a million from the wealthiest. Parish participation is important so even if you can't make a pledge of money, make a pledge of prayer and turn in your ACA envelope. And thanks for your concern and help.


