Dear People of God,

Over the past months I've been examining the existence of hell through the lens of a well-known poem: *The Divine Comedy* in which Dante Alighieri is led on a tour of the many levels of hell, each reserved for a specific species of sinner. Recall, sin is the deliberate performance of some act which alienates the person from God or neighbor or even the self. Without any connection to God, the sinner who dies unreconciled is unable to enter heaven so must go somewhere and that's hell. Because the sinner repudiates God by willing to sin, the decision to "go to hell" is always that of the sinner, not God.

Dante wanted to articulate the sins that led to hell and the punishments those sins merited. He did so by describing the so-called circles or levels of hell, each one "lower" than those above and each consisting of an atmosphere associated with the nature of the sin. Today we're pretty deep into these circles at the level of **Violence**.

This level is actually sub-divided into three rings, each representing acts against the love of neighbor, of self, or of God. Although it may seem counterintuitive, the least significant of these are sins against the neighbor. Yes, these sins can be truly devastating and Dante saw on this level tyrants, murderers, those who wage war for no necessary reason and others who are all swimming in a river of burning blood - supposedly that spilled by their victims. Many of those named in this area were familiar, bloodthirsty people in Dante's time but not ours. The one we'd all recognize is Attila the Hun. I suppose Vlad Tepes would also be there and perhaps any of us can name a few more recent tyrants who made it down to this level.

The second ring is reserved for those who sin against themselves leading to their own destruction. He singles out a few noted suicides but includes those who undertook actions which resulted in their early or violent death. Again, in our contemporary society, we can discern a lot of people who foolishly and too often deliberately choose to do things which are dangerous and deadly - the person who speeds along Alexis and causes a wreck in which he and several others die, or the person who chooses to buy unidentified drugs and too late discovers they're laced with a deadly level of fentanyl. In a culture which increasingly fails to help people develop a wholesome sense of self, there are no doubt many destined to this awful state, the only one which Dante says will miss out on the resurrection since they have thrown way their body.

The third ring is for those who gravely offend God, Art (God's creation) and Nature (God's ordered universe). These sinners are deprived of the presence of God and it is here that we first come across Dante suggesting that in hell, we are deprived of the good things of God's creation. There are three sorts of people and corresponding punishments in this level on which Dante expends quite a lot of ink. And as so have I, I will return to the eighth level of hell next week.

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
