Dear People of God,

I hope to conclude my series on time, talent and treasure today so let's see how well I can draw things to a conclusion.

I've been discussing the three duties of the good Christian through the lens of entitlement and I'd like to do that with our sense of sharing treasure with the Church and for that matter any other charity. Entitlement always puts the *me* ahead of the *us* and well ahead of *them*. Allow me to share an example.

A parish was in need of a new boiler so planned a "Major Fund Raiser" which will feature a dinner and a silent auction. Envelopes were placed on the tables for donations. The silent auction included a number of items, all of which had the value listed. Enter the entitlement mentality. Guests forked out for the dinner so the donation envelopes were largely unused. The silent auction had a trip to Bimini aboard the *Minnow* valued at \$4,800. Enter the entitlement mentality. Although most such fund raising auctions feature an array of donated items, occasionally an organization pays for a premiere and alluring item as the parish did in this case, paying half the cost. The successful bid of \$1875 produced a loss rather than a benefit.

Unfortunately, that is not the uncommon fate of many charitable fund raisers. Guests lose sight of the idea that **the goal is to raise funds**. To entice people to the silent auction, the sponsoring organization may have to absorb some of the dinner costs, thus impacting the fund raising. Given the fund raising intent of the event, sponsors should consider using the stated values of silent auction items as the starting point of the bidding.

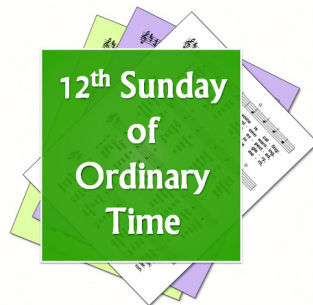
When the parish was founded, there was a custom to hold an annual "flour auction." The five-pound sack of flour was donated by the mill and at the auction, the winner immediately donated it back and this went on until everyone present had purchased the flour which was then donated to the organization for its use. Fund raising raised funds.

Today those with an entitlement mentality seek a deal and often do not exert an effort for the success of the fund raiser; it is too much of a bother to seek additional donations. Some even complain at a failure to get a deal on a desired silent auction item.

I was at an art auction some years ago where the overall value of the art works donated by local artists was around \$15,000. The entitlement mentality brought in a lot of people looking for a deal. I put in a few bids and "won" everything because few understood that the whole idea was to realize at least \$15,000 and perhaps twice that, thanks to generosity. Needless to say the artists were not pleased, there was no second art auction and the organization which needed the funds had to settle for far less than was needed for their worthy projects.

When it comes to a parish and its monetary good health, there is no poison worse than the entitlement mentality. It robs the parish of much needed regular income, reduces the opportunities for ministry and can actually lead to the parish closing its doors when the bills become overwhelming. Each one of us should do what we can to share time, talent and treasure with our parish and with our community. That's what social really means.

## *The Celebration of Sacraments*

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

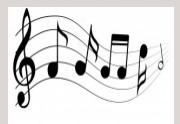

#### The HSP Soup Kitchen



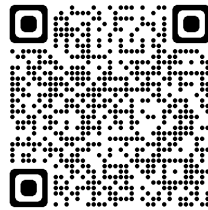

### Health News for June 25, 2023

**How is Metabolic Syndrome Treated?** Many of the conditions that contribute to metabolic syndrome can be addressed through lifestyle changes such as diet, exercise and weight loss. These steps can help you manage metabolic syndrome and improve your overall heart health:

- Eat better. Adopt a diet rich in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, skinless poultry, fish, nuts, lean meats and vegetable protein. Limit processed foods, saturated and trans fats, red meat, sodium and added sugars.
- Get active. Aim for at least 150 minutes of moderate intensity physical activity a week. Walking is the easiest place to start.
- Lose weight. Balance healthy eating with exercise to reach and maintain a healthy weight.
- Work with your health care team to manage your blood glucose, cholesterol and blood pressure. Take your medications as prescribed.
