Dear People of God,

The other day someone mentioned to me that they were watching an old movie and heard the preacher tell the couple he was marrying that they were entering a "holy estate." The parishioner wondered what that meant since the two lovebirds were poor as church mice. The term "estate" is from the middle ages and meant a position in the social system which moderated the way people related to other people in that same estate or in one of the others. Today we would refer to these as the social classes and they are generally determined by where people land on the economic scale: poverty, middle class, upper class. You may recall now and then hearing that the news media is the "Fifth Estate" so there must be four others.

In the Church we call those others **vocations** and consider only three rather than four and rarely do we refer to any of them as estates although we could since the relational quality of any of them would be the same. In case you're wondering, the four great estates were the royals, the nobility, the commercial freeholders and the peasants. That's pretty much the same socio-economic breakdown we recognize today without the royal titles. Each of these was a well-defined social class or *estate* and people in any of them related to others based on the clearly defined classes. It was a way of assuring the order of society was maintained which is probably why it took so long to get out of those infamous "dark ages."

The Church recognizes three vocations, all of which are meant to help people in them become "holy as the Father is holy." (you may recall some weeks ago I mentioned the essential, unedited words of Jesus and these are some of them) And yes, the vocations exist to help maintain order in the Church and in the lives of God's people whether in the Church or not. They are Single, Married and Religious. Each has certain expectations if you happen to be in it and all of them provide a means of getting along in an orderly way.

The largest of these in the Church is the **single** vocation. Being single suggests there's a way of relating to others based on truly being single. As this "estate" consists of everybody from birth to the time they elect one of the other two, we might begin to see some of the relational behaviors that ought to mark out people who have been called to be single. In essence, they behave with a broader sense of freedom to explore opportunities, friendships, career options and self-development, all of which are going to be severely limited if we choose to get involved in any other vocation. We'll return to being single in a bit but first it's necessary to describe the second largest vocation and that's **marriage**.

There's been a lot of controversy over marriage in the recent past but the Church has its own definition of what that vocational summons involves, a subject which will receive significant treatment next week.

### *The Celebration of Sacraments*

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

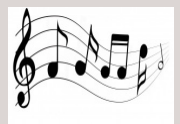

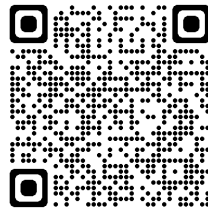

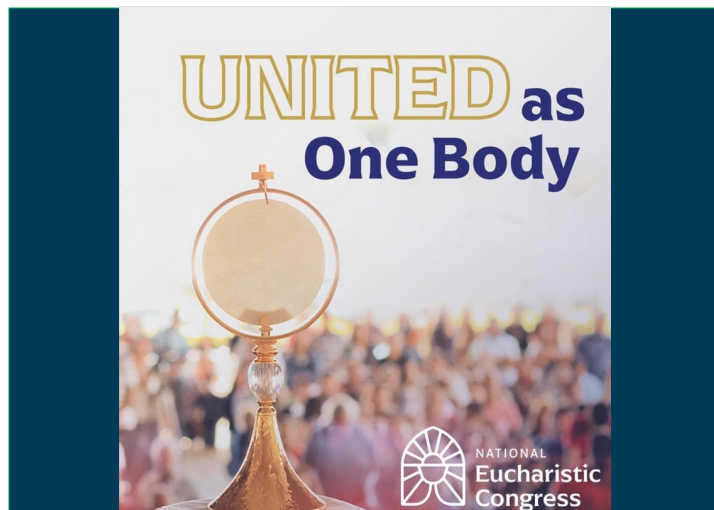
