Dear People of God,

Ohioans are currently in the process of voting on Issue 1; although it only proposes to change the way the state constitution is amended, it has far reaching consequences for future ballot issues. One of those is the hot-button issue of abortion coming up for a vote this November with the possibility of ending up in the Ohio Constitution; I, however, do not think that the Constitution should be used as a legislative tool (I have always voted, however, when Article XVI, §3 is on the ballot). Keep in mind that a NO vote on Issue 1 (don't make the change) maintains the current amendment process while a YES vote (do strengthen the amendment requirements) tightens up the process. Given the current focus on abortion, I wanted to share some insights from the teaching of our Church with regard to abortion and the arguments which are often proposed to support it as a "right." I begin by stating that all of these arguments are specious. Specious is a word that means the same thing as does space, the emptiness between objects. The arguments for a right to abortion are all full of empty space. Unfortunately, a misunderstanding exists as to what a right is; consequently, the typical arguments begin with a major error behind them.

So, what is a right? There are two species of *right*. The most fundamental (and the one behind all of the specious rights I'll be discussing later) is the *natural*, *human right*. All humans, regardless of age, gender, race, creed, and ethnicity have rights because they are human or universal. If some group, race, creed or whatever does not have one, then it is not an ordinary human right and falls into the next category. The second is a *grant of privilege* to some particular group (for example, those over the age of 18 in Ohio can vote, smoke, marry, etc.) by those who can, or think they can, grant that privilege. So, let's get to the claimed rights to an abortion.

Argument 1 - There is a reproductive right – Well, that's true, but when we speak of rights (and this one is a natural human right everybody has), we also have to speak of the consequences and obligations which are attached to the exercise of the right.

The Church would not argue that we humans have rights to reproduction; in fact that's one of the essential aspects of being a human person, although the Church will tell us that the exercise of the right, because of the consequence and obligations which come along with its exercise, should be reserved to the married state where those consequences and obligations can best be met.

The reproductive right is exercised during ordinary human intercourse and the Church would – again in the married state – defend that right. Anything after that moment is no longer the right but the consequences and/or obligations that accrue from its exercise. From my high school biology class, I learned that it is quite possible (consequential) that when exercising the reproductive right, a conception may occur so before exercising the right, I had better be aware of the obligations resulting from a conception.

Unfortunately, there is a mistaken sense that what occurred during intercourse continues as an extension of the original right without any connection to the consequences (pregnancy) and obligations (childbirth and child rearing). In part, this is the result of a subject I mentioned last summer: the infamous entitlement culture. Because we feel entitled to the freedom to engage in actions, we deny or shirk any necessity to live with the consequences of those actions since we're entitled to one part of the whole but none of the others.

Because the natural right ends when intercourse ends and the obligations then begin, the argument that an abortion is an aspect of the reproductive right falls far short of the trajectory of the truth. Since "rights" are such a repetitive claim relevant to abortion and they are a complicated subject, next week my "rights" discussion will continue with references to the role of the founding fathers and the familiar documents they created identifying and discussing our "inalienable rights."

The Celebration of Sacraments

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
