

Dear People of God,

I've been working on a series touching on the more common arguments in favor of abortion, ones that are often marketed as "pro choice" in order to appeal to people who oppose abortion. I think I've exhausted the topic of reproductive rights so I want to move on to an argument which essentially states that people have the right to privacy regarding the use of their bodies. Oh, if only it were so!

Why do I say that? Because if it's a real right inherent to human beings, then it comes with the balancing obligation to respect the rights of others to that same exclusive determination of the use of their bodies. [Remember, all genuine human rights are universal, everyone has them and all are associated with all of the ordinary consequences attached to their exercise and the ensuing obligation to deal with those consequences.]

Pushing the privacy argument depends almost entirely on the entitlement culture because those who claim it rarely extend that same right to anyone else, particularly the consequential child conceived because two people engaged in the not-so-private exercise of the right to use their bodies as they chose. It's not so private because it violates the underlying claim being made by those who make use of this argument to facilitate abortion; it still requires two to tango. We also know that far too many people who claim this same "right" to privacy regarding the use of their body actively violate the rights of others. Rape, child molestation, and sexual battery are common headlines reflecting the far-too-common behaviors of the entitled who believe they can use their own body as they please without any of the consequences or obligations which might arise.

At any rate, if we claim the right to the personal determination of how we use our body, then we have to give that same permission to everyone else. It's only a right if others have it to the same extent we do. An abortion exercising a "right" over my own body deprives somebody else (recall that several times in the Old Testament God tells the prophets "before you were born I called you by name) of the right, its exercise and even of the far greater right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

In actuality, this right to the body in an abortion also deprives the other person who contributed to the consequential pregnancy of any co-equal right to determine whether the obligations should be met or not. Rights are never one-sided but entitlement behaviors are in a culture in which the self supercedes the community. A privilege can be and has been extended to a small group of people to undertake behaviors which violate numerous rights of others. This is so because any pregnancy involves the mother, the father, the family, the community and each of these has rights with regard to the continued existence of the community and the family. As a people or a Church or a nation, we have a very real right to ask who the tens of millions of aborted men and women are, what might they have accomplished toward the common good and how might they have challenged any of us to live a richer, more productive life. As Americans, this so-called "right" should be measured against the goals set forth by our founders. As Church we should weigh this so-called right against the Great Command: Love God, and love your neighbor as you love yourself. There can be no neighbor closer than that not yet born.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


