

Welcome, one and all! Today we mark the liturgical conclusion of the one hundred sixtieth anniversary of the founding of the Historic Church of St. Patrick. Liturgy had always been the core activity of the parish so it is right that we take this opportunity to celebrate with our Diocesan Bishop at the table of the Lord. Word and Sacrament remind us of the love of God poured so abundantly into our lives.

As you know, the Universal Church, the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) and our own Bishop have urged us to a greater appreciation of and love for the Blessed Sacrament. Tragicallv. many Catholics today have lost their firm conviction that in the celebration of the Eucharist, Jesus Christ is truly made present. Our celebration today underscores the faith of our ancestors whose sacrifices in the midst of great poverty raised up this magnificent space to encounter the living Lord Jesus Christ. We recall the continued love of God among the many who added to and maintained the beauty and splendor of this House of God because they understood that uniquely here, they would receive the gift of Christ's divine presence into their very being. We are here to continue the celebration begun so long ago, meet the Christ at the Table and bring him into the world as we go our separate ways this week. Our hearts should be filled with joy that we have been blessed by the past and present and prayerfully will be in the future here at the Historic Church of St. Patrick.

This weekend (Saturday Oct. 7th) also marks the Patronal Feast Day of our Diocese: Our Lady of the Rosary. The twenty mysteries of the rosary trace key moments of Jesus' life shared with us and the promise of our own sharing in his life via those last few mysteries which reveal his love of Mary and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Take the opportunity throughout the month of October to pray the rosary and meditate on Christ's sharing his life with you and the world.

We also take note of the on-going Synod of Bishops in Rome which began on October 4th to finalize the months of study, prayer and research on the topic of Synodality. Bishop Kevin Rhoades, who inaugurated our liturgical celebration of the anniversary last January, is among the members of the Synod. We'll be watching the final report and its results over the months to come. Pray for those in Rome that their work will accomplish much for the life of our beloved Church.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Early Voting Against Issues 1 & 2
