

Dear People of God,

Most of us don't like hearing about money at church but I'd like to talk money today in spite of that, not to ask for some (although if you have a winning lottery ticket I hope you'll share a little with the parish) but to give thanks for what you have been able to do.

As I'm sure you know, the Living Christ Capital Campaign is now in its collection phase. We should all be excited that during a period of inflation, the parish not only met its goal but exceeded it and, far more importantly, despite the pledge redemptions going on, our Sunday collections remain strong. That generosity is certainly a gift of God for the diocese and our parish. The goal was sixty-five million dollars and if all the pledges materialize, the final tally will provide over a hundred and five million dollars for endowed trusts, revitalization of ministry and capital (construction) projects all across the diocese including right here at the Historic Church of St. Patrick.

All of us should be equally excited at the magnificent shrine areas being developed on our campus: St. Joseph, Brendan the Navigator, and Bridget Shrines with the additional outdoor Stations of the Cross to carry the Good News beyond our doors and into the public eye. Soon, shrines honoring Our Lady of Knock and St. Columba will be added to further enhance our property and proclaim both our faith and our deep Irish roots.

Preservation Society projects can be seen all around us, from the safety exit steps along the west side of the church to the ongoing restoration of our doors and to the repairs and maintenance of the church roof which, while we may not be able to see it, is just as important as anything more visible on our property.

None of what we and our visitors can see would be possible without you. Your love of this venerable old church and its campus reveals a far more important love of God who has invited us to be stewards of the parish in this period of time. We ought all to be proud that we will be passing on the Historic Church of St. Patrick to those who will follow us, a church in better condition than we found it. All of that has required a lot of money and as pastor, I extend a very real *Thank You* for sharing some with the parish! May God reward your generosity.

### *The Celebration of Sacraments*

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


