

Dear People of God,

The Friday just past was the patronal feast day of the United States and of our sister parish at Immaculate Conception. The particular favor shown Mary in anticipation of her role in bringing Jesus our savior into the world is truly a momentous opportunity to consider not so much the favor she received, but the far greater favor we received because she said "yes" to the will of God. That "yes" began the historic process of our salvation in and through the son she would bear. That simple "yes" opened the gates to heaven, provided food for the journey in the Eucharist, and pledged God's abiding love for all eternity to those who believe.

The celebration of Mary does not end on December 8 but continues on the 12<sup>th</sup> when the Church recalls the miraculous events at Tepyac in what is today Mexico City. There the Virgin mother of God appeared to an indigenous convert to Christianity and asked that a small chapel be built on the now famous hill. Our Lady of Guadeloupe, the title given to that apparition of the Blessed Mother, offered an oppressed people the same hope of salvation Mary has brought to other times and places and it is there that we can see the only representation of Mary while pregnant with the Son of God.

(You might be interested to learn that the symbols on the garments in which Our Lady appeared are a written testament in the ancient language of the Aztec peoples and alert them to the birth of a great King who will liberate them. Given the harsh treatment of the Spanish conquistadores, that was great Good News!) Our Lady of Guadeloupe is the Patroness of the Western Hemisphere as well as of numerous nations in Central and South America. She is also the patroness of the Catholic Right to Life movement which seeks to ennoble the life and dignity of every child conceived.

Of course, we also make note of the role of Mary in the nativity of Jesus on the 25<sup>th</sup>. Indeed, we should all make note of Mary's role in salvation history and perhaps consider our own role in the continuing story of salvation. As we anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth in a couple of weeks, we could perhaps take time to consider whether the Christ has truly come to life within us as individuals, family, parish, diocese and nation. Jesus didn't just come to be made a ceramic infant in a crib under the tree, but a very real person who walks with us on the journey of life. May these weeks of the new liturgical season enrich your walk.

#### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

<u>In the event that you are in need of a priest or deacon and there is no one in the office:</u> Please try the emergency number at 419-243-6031 and leave a message with your phone number and your call will be returned as soon as possible.








## The Historic Church of St. Patrick's Parish/Community Activities!

#### Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.
