

A Blessed and Happy Christmas to one and all!

Nollaig shona shona daoibh go léir

As we gather to commemorate the birth of Jesus our Lord and Savior, may the real meaning of the Holy Day infuse your thoughts, your words, and your actions. We might look at the event we recall to learn how it ought to affect us today.

Jesus was born in humble surroundings, an invitation to humility in our own lives, whether in terms of how or where we live, what sort of transportation we use, which kind of chair we sit in and all sorts of others things that can distract us from the needs of the world around us. That notion of humility might make us consider how we use or abuse the things of the earth to make ourselves comfortable. Do we really need water in plastic bottles that are clogging the oceans with toxic litter? Do we really need to crank the furnace up to 80° or the AC down to 65? Do we really need all those devices that use rechargeable lithium batteries that are so toxic that we don't yet know where to get rid of them when they die? Jesus was born without anything of value, an invitation to consider what really matters for our own well -being and that of "our neighbor." As we think of the role we play in the civil structures around us, do we venerate power or do we seek justice? Is our first concern "What's in it for me?" or do we genuinely respect the dignity and worth of others with whom we share the earth? Do we have any idea the status of men, women and children in far flung areas of the world?

Christmas has become a secular spending spree sprinkled with football, super post–Christmas sales and presents, presents, presents. Take time in all of that – which is after all good – to allow some of what Jesus represents to be part of our celebration and you'll likely find it far more meaningful and far happier.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Parish/Community Activities!

Whenever a county/City within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency

during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.

Health News for December 24, 2023 FOOD SAFETY TIPS FOR HEALTHY HOLI-

DAYS: Cook. Food is safely cooked when it reaches a high enough internal temperature to kill harmful bacteria.

• Color is not a reliable indicator of doneness. Use a food thermometer to make sure meat, poultry, and fish are cooked to a safe internal temperature. To check a turkey for safety, insert a food thermometer into the innermost part of the thigh and wing and the thickest part of the breast. The turkey is safe when the temperature reaches 165°F. If the turkey is stuffed, the temperature of the stuffing should be 165°F.

• Bring sauces, soups, and gravies to a rolling boil when reheating.

• Cook eggs until the yolk and white are firm. When making your own eggnog or other recipe calling for raw eggs, use pasteurized shell eggs, liquid or frozen pasteurized egg products, or powdered egg whites.

• Don't eat uncooked cookie dough, which may contain raw eggs and raw flour.

Bonus Tip: Use Care with Stuffing! Whether it is cooked inside or outside the bird, all stuffing and dressing must be cooked to a minimum temperature of 165°F. For optimum safety, cooking your stuffing in a casserole dish is recommended.
