

Dear People of God,

As we consider the Court's overruling Roe v Wade (Did you know Roe regretted taking part in that law suit?), we might want to consider why the Church believes abortion is gravely wrong. The recent celebration of Christmas ought to give us a heads up on the essential reasoning behind the stand: go back nine months to the Annunciation. Gabriel announced to Mary - you will conceive in your womb and bear a son. The angel didn't say a son would magically appear nine months later; he's there when Mary gives her yes to salvation's birth. Then, just a few weeks afterward, Mary goes to assist Elizabeth in her own moment of childbirth and the infant leapt in my womb at the presence of Jesus – not a Jesus we might get in the future, but a Jesus very much present as Elizabeth notes when she greets Mary: How is it the mother of my savior should come to me. Even the reaction of John still in the womb to the presence of Jesus should alert us to the full humanity of the unborn.

Recently a family in the mid-west, informed that their child would die within a few minutes of birth, elected to allow that child to be born so that its organs could be gifted to other newborns who desperately needed

them. A child who could so easily have been aborted and disposed of became a source of life for others. Life is sacred, or should be. Perhaps the lack of respect for life at the beginning can help explain lack of respect for life anywhere along its course so that domestic violence, child abuse, school shootings, subway stabbings, road rage and other similar behaviors can be seen to have roots. Far-fetched? Perhaps not given the tried and true law of cause and effect modern science relies on to explain all sorts of things. Indeed, if we can so easily devalue life at its beginning, why would we think it ever develops some irrefutable value later?

The Church values every life: that of the unborn regardless of who it might be, that of children who should be safe in our schools, that of teens who ought not fear being shot at a mall lunch counter, that of young adults beginning their careers and that of our seasoned seniors whose wisdom could be of great value to society at large.

Christmas reminds us that human life begins in the womb and already has immeasurable value far beyond that of the immediate family but for all of humankind

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

The Historic Church of St. Patrick's Parish/Community Activities!

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency

during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses.

Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass.

If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or inter-

net, making a spiritual Communion.

When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled.



Health News for January 14, 2024

Flu vs COVID-19. Flu and COVID-19 are caused by different viruses that can be spread among people. Flu is caused by the influenza virus. COVID-19 is caused by SARS-CoV-2. Both can give you a fever, cough, headaches, and body aches. Flu and COVID-19 also spread similarly. They're transmitted by small particles that come from your nose and mouth when you sneeze, cough, sing, or talk, raising the possibility of infecting people who are nearby. Infected people may not have symptoms, but can still pass along either virus. COVID-19 symptoms can take longer than flu symptoms to develop. Someone with flu usually has symptoms 1 to 4 days after being infected. A person with COVID-19 typically shows symptoms about 5 days after infection, although this can range from 2 to 14 days. One telling sign of COVID-19 in some cases is loss of smell or taste. But because of other similar symptoms, there's really only one way to be certain if you have COVID-19 or flu: Get tested.
