Are you looking for something to do this Lent to grow in your relationship with Jesus? Adoration is one possible way to do this. Please join us at 4:00-5:00 p.m. on Wednesdays during Lent at Historic St. Patrick's to do this.

We can pray in a variety of different ways and here are some suggestions:

Pray the psalms.

Meditate using Scripture, a favorite passage or chapter.

Read the life of a saint and pray with him or her.

Ask for forgiveness and intercede and pray for others.

Pray the Rosary

Sit quietly and just “be” in the presence of God.

Make prayer a part of your Lenten plan this year to do something different. Prayer is sure needed. Come for one or all adoration dates if you feel Jesus is guiding you to do this. The dates are February 21st, 28th, March 6th, 13th, and the 20th for an hour.

WHAT IS SHROVE TUESDAY?

Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday. Shrove is the past tense of the verb to schrive which means to obtain penance and give absolution. There is a Catholic custom of going to confession on Shrove Tuesday to prepare for Lent.

Carnival comes from the Latin words carne vale meaning "farewell to the flesh" like other Catholic holidays and celebrations it likely has its roots in pre-Christian traditions based on the seasons.

Other names for Shrove Tuesday:

Fat Tuesday

Pancake Tuesday

Mardi Gras

WHAT 'S WITH THE PANCAKES?

Pancakes were an easy way for Christians to use up their milk, eggs and sugar before the 40 days of fasting during Lent. Lent involved adopting a simpler diet, without the luxuries of "fattening" foods.

THE USE OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY

The act of applying ashes to our forehead symbolizes our mortality as well as our need for ongoing repentance.

Ashes are applied to our forehead in the sign of the cross as the words, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return" are spoken to us. The other formula which is used, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" emphasizes our call to continual conversion and holiness of life. These ashes are obtained from palms that have been burnt from the year before.

FAST AND ABSTINANCE

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday those who are 18 but not yet 60 can fast by only having one full meal. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed. Eating between meals should be avoided.

Those who are 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Friday's of Lent.

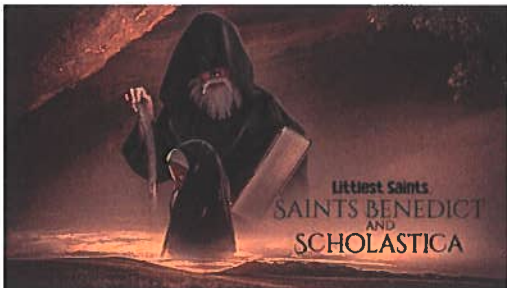

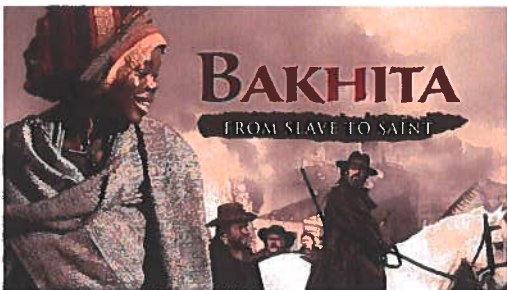
