

Dear People of God,

As the Civil War raged in the south, Toledo experienced a burst in growth, much of it the result of Irish immigration into the region. Those newly arriving men and women and their families came to Toledo seeking the same things we seek today: peace, a good job and a decent place to live. Despite being among the lowest paid workers in Ohio, those original Irish settlers showed their love of God by giving back to that God the magnificent church in which we celebrate God's abiding presence today. Building a comparable structure in 2024 would cost upwards of \$35,000,000. That leads me to a very serious question: Do we love God enough to assure that future generations will have this same worship space, or even this wonderful old parish?

Our Diocese is currently involved in *Intentional Planning*, a process of examining the spiritual and sacramental needs of the Catholic population and adjusting ministerial services to assure that the best possible space, time and opportunities are there for worship, education and outreach. Of course, a key component of that process is trying to determine the "where" of future sacramental celebration, that is, which parishes will best be able to serve the People of God in the diocese. Over the past thirty years the necessity of closing parishes (the first parish closed after the diocese was created in 1910 came about in 1912 and closures have occurred ever since) has led to many Catholics abandoning the faith - they go nowhere. Intentional Planning includes among its various aspects parish sustainability, ultimately the reason any parish has ever closed in the long history of our diocese.

The key to sustainability lies in two interconnected realities: people and income. People are essential to any parish; they form the living presence of Jesus Christ as the Body of Christ present beyond the walls of the parish church. That presence isn't easy to put forth where there aren't enough people because ordinary ministries aren't available to provide insights, additional formation and education; this lack impacts those who should be evangelizing the family, the neighborhood and the community with a life that models the presence of Christ. Not enough people in the pews also means less cash in the collection basket which exacerbates the issues of not enough ministry, not enough formation, etc.

To be sustainable, a parish should be growing in numbers, not shrinking. New families with children are an essential element of a sustainable parish. New members coming in through the welcome and instruction of those not yet Catholic and not yet baptized are a component of sustainability. These necessary elements don't just happen; they occur because the people live out the call to holiness begun in Baptism and nourished at the Table of the Lord every Sunday. Our lives, whom we talk to, those with whom we interact and those to whom we open ourselves create an invitation which leads to a growing, lively parish. We all need to do our part.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
