

Dear friends, parishioners and visitors,

May the most Irish of blessings and greetings find you on this happy celebration of the great Saint of Ireland: Patrick! The warmest of welcomes to Toledo's Irish Destination parish: The Historic Church of St. Patrick as we come together to the Table of the Lord to share Word and Sacrament in celebration this joyous day.

Here in America St. Patrick's Day has become a time for music, dance, Irish coffee, Jiggs dinner and Guinness. But if we delve into the life and times of St. Patrick, he knew none of that beyond perhaps the music and dance celebrated not in his honor but as the ordinary entertainment of the people of the Emerald Isle. Patrick was far more concerned with matters spiritual than those which warm the hearth or stomach. His goal as he walked across the island nation was to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ and inspire men and women to achieve the dignity of being the daughters and sons of God. He sought to ennoble the Irish by opening their minds, hearts and souls to the wonder of God's true presence in the Eucharist. Patrick wished for all Irish the warmth of welcome and hospitality, of knowing the love of God and offering that same love back to God and neighbor. His success brought about an amazing response in the foundation of monasteries, convents, parishes, mighty cathedrals and a people. who came to be called the most catholic

on earth.

As we gather today to celebrate St. Patrick, we may well have on our minds the Jiggs dinner we plan at home or elsewhere, we may be humming an Irish tune in anticipation of heading to one of many Irishthemed celebrations around the city, we may already have iced down a Smithwick's Red or Kilkenny Ale, but we ought also to pause in thanks for the values St. Patrick kindled among the Irish. Had it not been for the deep roots of faith Patrick set into Ireland's soil, our Church, the Catholic Church, would look very different. Irish monks preserved vital documents, evangelized much of northern Europe, gave structure to our sacramental life and informed a people who for centuries and in spite of conquest and poverty, famine and drought, war and pestilence, never lost sight of the love of God and enculturated that into a people who knew happiness and joy through it all.

This past several months Ireland has experienced a series of extraordinarily disastrous winter storms. High winds, high seas, rain and snow, ice and floods have battered the Emerald Isle, leaving almost no county unscathed. Our celebration today includes a sincere prayer that through the intercession of St. Patrick, those same values of love of God and neighbor will see the people of Ireland to better

times, a bright and beautiful spring, and a season of grace under the constant care of the God of love.

May the constant care of Patrick always be at your side.

### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
