

Dear People of God,

On Palm Sunday we heard proclaimed the Passion account from the Gospel of Mark. This is the oldest and shortest of the accounts of Jesus' death (it originally had no resurrection account - that was added some time later when the Resurrection became part and parcel of the mystery of our redemption). To some extent Mark's account provided the framework on which the ensuing authors would hang the events they wanted to memorialize in their own reflections on the Passion and death. The underlying theme of Mark's entire gospel is that Jesus alone, by his own decision and will, accepted crucifixion and death in order to save humankind from the effects of original sin. As we read the passion, it becomes obvious that no one actually puts Jesus on the Cross - he accepts it as his obligation to his Father's command for obedience.

When proclaimed, the long version of the Passion begins at the Last Supper the night before Jesus' death. The early Church understood that the sacred meal, the Eucharist, encapsulated not just a radically transformed Seder but the entire gamut of Jesus' few days in Jerusalem when he was thirty-three. Thursday is inseparable from Friday and Saturday! Like the Trinity, they are distinct but one.

The Seder or Passover Supper consisted of a variety of simple foods, each of which symbolized some aspect of the slavery into which Israel had fallen in Egypt.



There was salt water (sweat), bitter herbs (the agony of being enslaved), Haroseth (a mixture of copped apple and raisins symbolizing the mud bricks Israel had to make) unleavened bread (the bread of haste no time to let the yeast rise because liberation was at hand) and the roasted lamb which was the sign and symbol of Israel's obedience to the command of God (the blood was painted on the lintel of the doorway to let the angel of death know to pass by). The ceremony began with the famous questions asked by the youngest person at table and answered by the oldest (the symbolism here is that of teaching an important truth): Why is this night different than any other? Why do we eat these strange foods? Why do we eat standing (meals were ordinarily shared while reclining at table).

This ritual was strictly followed: no changes, no additions, no exclusions. Imagine the shock among the Twelve when Jesus changes things, adds the truth that bread and wine are no longer bread and wine and then excluded all the other aspects of the Seder in favor of the Eucharistic elements he inaugurates. Like us today, the Apostles had a choice, a difficult one – to believe what Jesus has done, what he has given, or reject it outright. Every time we approach the altar, we face that same decision – do we

> believe? If we do, what then? The Apostles became wandering missionaries proclaiming this wondrous miracle, calling others to their belief that Jesus Christ remains one with his people. We're supposed to do the same.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


