

Dear People of God,

Today I'll be looking at the third of the sacraments of initiation: The Eucharist. I hope we all know that Holy Communion is the real Body and Blood of Jesus the Christ, truly present under the external appearance of bread and wine. Our complex theology states that the substance (what a thing is) is transformed by the *form* of this sacrament to become a substance we cannot see as such (the real presence of Jesus). You may remember this as transubstantiation from religion class years ago. The *matter* involved is the bread and wine which become the Body and Blood of Jesus when conjoined with the *form* or words of consecration. The appearance doesn't change but what it is does changes.

The sacrament is always celebrated within the context of the Mass when a lot of other things are happening. The rite of the Eucharist is surrounded by:

The Penitential Act – our admission we are the sinners Jesus came to save.

The liturgy of the Word – four readings (the Psalm is scriptural, too) with some explanation (the homily) or application to today's world.

The offertory or presentation of our gifts of self, water/wine and offerings (usually the collection envelope) for the work of the Church.

The Prayers of the Eucharist (listen closely and you'll hear the great universal petitions). The actual joining of matter and form can occur at the beginning or in the middle of this ritual.

The celebration – Lord's prayer through approaching the table of the Lord to share the Body and Blood of Jesus

The Sending Forth - a final commissioning of the people to go out to all nations, teaching and baptizing.

The matter (bread and wine) and the form (the words of consecration) never change but much of the other rituals can and do change. The penitential act can take on several different forms, the readings from Scripture constantly change over a three-year cycle, and the Eucharistic Prayers cannot change in themselves but there are options today for ten Eucharistic prayers and another three for Masses with Children.

The essential form comes from Sacred Scripture, one of Paul's letters in which he writes the words of institution; the matter, bread (made of nothing but flour and water) and wine never change. That way we can be assured we receive the humanity and divinity of Jesus every time we go to Communion.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

When Extreme Heat Threatens: Be Safe.
