

Dear People of God,

Not that long ago people were wondering when Lent would begin and here we are at Palm Sunday, the festival of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. I'm not sure why, but Palm Sunday through Easter has become a rather dour period for our Church. It wasn't always so. Jesus elected to begin his Passion during the festivities of the Passover. This was not a dark time of sadness and mourning; rather, it was several days of excitement, dancing, music, singing and partying because the Passover marked the Exodus from slavery to freedom. God reminded the people as they prepared to leave Egypt to mark the day and celebrate it with joy and exuberance.

I imagine that most of us have been conditioned by what I refer to as "Jesus movies," most of which have little to do with the historical period or behaviors we would have seen and experienced when Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Passover could only be celebrated in Jerusalem because the people had to have a lamb sacrificed or slaughtered at the Temple. A huge crowd gathered, jostled, and dickered in the marketplace for the various sacred items used during the meal and for the party supplies for the celebration which followed. At the Passover meal, keep in mind that everybody enjoyed three glasses (not sips) of wine so by the time the memorial meal ended, folks were getting pretty happy (no wonder the Apostles fell asleep when they got back to their camp site) and then shared a final cup which was passed around: the cup of Jeremiah which hearkened the arrival of the Messiah.

"Jesus movies" want to be respectful of Jesus/God so try to be overly pious, but the first century was anything but. The crowd lining the road into Jerusalem for the entrance would have been shouting, shoving, singing praises of God (*Hosanna in the highest*), chasing little kids, carrying luggage or bleating lambs for the sacrificial meal: into this we then hear the crowd go wild that Jesus is coming. Imagine the hubbub at any parade when the star of the show passes by and you get the picture. Over the centuries all of that excitement has disappeared and the entry on Palm Sunday is dry and often unattractive, the only redeeming grace being the free palm fronds.

Why is that? Is not Jesus as exciting a guest in our churches as he was coming into Jerusalem two thousand years ago? Are we not ourselves in awe and wonder that our God comes to be one with us? Instead of a drab procession, shouldn't we be leaping for joy that the dawn of Christ's Exodus is glowing around us and the Passion, Death and Resurrection lie only hours away? Perhaps our lack of exuberance could be exalted if we truly reflected on what these holy days are all about. Please join your parish family all this week as we rejoice and celebrate.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
