


Dear People of God,

For anyone who claims to be Irish or has some Irish heritage, no matter how slight, the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock should be a source of comfort. For the Irish much of recent history saw the island beaten down, her people scattered and driven away by absentee landlords. The famine left millions dead and the land ravaged. Irish immigrants were not made welcome and many were deprived of opportunities for employment by the infamous sign "Irish need not apply."

It was to this community, in a tiny village of only a few houses in "the middle of nowhere" that the Mother of God, together with St. Jospeh and John the Evangelist, chose to appear. The village was small and most of the population heard about the vision and went to see. These were poor people with few "big city" connections, but they understood the message. Mary didn't say a word but she and the others gazed on a simple, small object against the back wall of the church: a lamb standing precisely where the tabernacle stood on the interior of St. Peter Church. The Eucharist was their strength, the Eucharist was their hope, the Eucharist was their life. Other apparitions of Mary occurred where there was no church and her message was clear: build one here and bring the Eucharist to the people. Buildings large and small rose up where Mary asked for one: Lourdes stands atop a steep crag, Guadeloupe was constructed on the ruins of an ancient Aztec temple, Mary major in Rome on a gentle slope where it snowed in August. Each of those buildings made the Eucharist available to people who might otherwise not have had Jesus in their midst.

Many non-Catholics misunderstand the reverence we Catholics have for Mary. However, we see in her not only a guide to her son but a model of what lies ahead at the resurrection for ourselves. Perhaps we might take up our rosary and reflect on the mysteries, not mysteries of her elegance but of the life Jesus chose to share with us and the mystery of the life we will share with him in the kingdom.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Health News for June 15, 2025

Fall Allergies. The most common culprit for fall allergies is ragweed, a plant that grows wild almost everywhere, but especially on the East Coast and in the Midwest. Ragweed blooms and releases pollen from August to November. In many areas of the country, ragweed pollen levels are highest in early to mid-September. Other plants that trigger fall allergies include:
