

Dear People of God,

Today the Universal Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, both of whom were martyred in Rome during the reign of Emperor Nero around the year 64. We know Peter as the first pope but if you examine his role in the gospels, you'll find he wasn't the staid, solemn person depicted in paintings; instead he was a typical rambunctious, overlyeager young man whom Jesus chose for that important role as leader because he knew Peter had the courage to leave home and the energy to travel ceaselessly to proclaim the New Dispensation in Jesus Christ. From legendary sources we also believe that Peter was, like many of us, often overwhelmed by the challenge of the gospels. If you visit Rome, you can find the Church of the Quo Vadis (Where are you going); it marks the place where Jesus encountered Peter trying to skip town when he discovered that the emperor was hot on his trail to have him executed. Legend tells us that Jesus asked Peter: "Must I go back and die again?" which led Peter to return to face his own crucifixion. There are two letters written by Peter in our New Testament collection.

Paul, as we know from Acts, became a Disciple of Jesus on the road to Damascus although falling off a horse didn't come along until the Middle Ages when an artist rendered the conversion that way. Like Peter, he devoted what remained of his life, about three decades, to the missionary work of the early Church, founding major Churches throughout the East. A brilliant scholar, Paul came to understand that the Old Testament was itself focused on Jesus and the ministry of reconciliation which led to his death and resurrection. Considered a great orator by his contemporaries (none of his speeches and homilies survive), he was also a magnificent poet who managed to relate the Good News in his letters with a skill which has rarely been equaled. He wrote numerous letters to the Churches he established; thirteen of these are included in the New Testament

Interestingly, neither Peter nor Paul was martyred in a public place. Peter died in the emperor's private hippodrome behind the summer palace atop the Vatican hill. Paul, a Roman citizen, was given a swift execution by beheading which occurred in the emperor's private gardens just outside the old city walls. By the mid-60's, those who ruled Rome already knew it would be dangerous-even if necessary - to execute the Church's principal leadership so did it privately. Another interesting bit of information regarding St. Peter's Basilica in Rome is that the façade doesn't mention Peter but you'll find the name Paul up there. Roman buildings more often bear the name of the pope who commissioned them than the saint in whose honor they were dedicated.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Health News for June 29, 2025

Seasonal Allergy Management and Treatment. If you feel like you're always getting sick, with a cough or head congestion, it's time to see an allergist. You may think you're sure pollen is causing your suffering, but other substances may be involved as well. More than two-thirds of spring allergy sufferers actually have year-round symptoms. Your best resource for finding what's causing your suffering and stopping it, not just treating the symptoms, is an allergist. Work together with your allergist to devise strategies to avoid your triggers:

Monitor pollen and mold counts. Weather reports in newspapers and on radio and television often include this information during allergy seasons.

- Keep windows and doors shut at home and in your car during allergy season.
- To avoid pollen, know which pollens you are sensitive to and then check pollen counts. In spring and summer, during tree and grass pollen season, levels are highest in the evening. In late summer and early fall, during ragweed pollen season, levels are highest in the morning.
- Take a shower, wash your hair and change your clothes after you've been working or playing outdoors.
- Wear a NIOSH-rated 95 filter mask when mowing the lawn or doing other chores outdoors, and take appropriate medication beforehand.
