

Dear People of God,

This coming Friday the Universal Church celebrates Saint James the Great, a label that inaccurately suggests he was more important than the other James ("the Less.)" Legend tells us that he was called "the greater" because he was the first of the two Apostles named James to become a disciple. This James is known to be the son of Zebedee who must have been a famous person or perhaps a big donor to the work of Jesus because his name appears more often in the New Testament than most of the disciples although none of the writers bothered to tell us anything about him other than that he owned fishing boats. Ironically, James the Great is not as important as James the Less.

James the Great has a famous brother. John. who's credited with writing a gospel and the Book of Revelations. The family was in the business of fishing which was the top of the economic ladder for Israelites in that time period. This James plays a bigger role in the Bible, often being with Jesus along with Peter and John so he must have had a special role among the Twelve. According to legend, James departed Jerusalem after Pentecost and evangelized in Asia Minor and Egypt, establishing what we know today as the Coptic Church. He was the first of the Apostles to be martyred (like Peter and Paul later, by direct order of the regional governor so he must have made a big enough splash evangelizing to come to the attention of Rome and the emperor). His body came to be buried in far northwest Spain.

It was fairly common in the good old days to steal the body of a famous person and bring it to a particular church or city to set up a shrine. This actually led to the body being lost but a miracle led a pious priest to discover the remains and the bishop ordered a major church to be built to honor St. James at the ancient cemetery (compostella). The shrine Santiago de Compostella stands at the end of an eight-hundred-mile series of pathways (camino) walked by millions of pilgrims. The cathedral church features a famous thurible, the Botafumiero, which swings across the transept wings of the church high above the people. Although he died from decapitation, James is often depicted with a club because he was beaten severely before being martyred.

At any rate, why do I think James is referred to as "the greater?" It's true he came along first, but I think he was both older and taller than the other James, whose father we also know: Alphaeus who must also have been famous to get his name into the Bible. However James the Great wasn't the more important of the two. James, son of Alphaeus, is often referred to as the "brother of the Lord," and he remained in Jerusalem where he chaired the first ecumenical council of the Church around the year sixty. James the Less is considered one of the principle patriarchs equal to Peter in the early history of the Church.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


