

Dear People of God,

Pope Francis has designated all of 2025 as a "Jubilee Year of Hope." The Jubilee is celebrated every twenty-five years and has come to include special gatherings for various communities within the greater community of the Church, the Body of Christ. Many of these occur in Rome, as for instance, a Jubilee of Teenagers, Youth, Married Couples, Families, Grandparents, the Sick, Migrants, Homeless and others. We might learn from all of this how a parish or diocese ought to function to make the most of the graces so abundantly poured out by the Holy Spirit.

It should be obvious that the Universal Church recognizes that there are any number of communities which together make up the Church; each of those smaller communities has its own needs, its own culture and calls for unique and diversified responses from the Church. That means we are not a "one size fits all" ecclesial family. We are many called into the singular unity of Jesus Christ by our participation in the sacraments. However, all too often we attempt to push everybody into one template rather than address the sense of a community of communities.

Pope St. John Paul II wrote a lot about the family as the "unit cell of the Church," often referring to the family as the "domestic Church." You can read a magnificent description of the family as Church in his *Letter to Families* which can be found at Reger's, on-line, or in a Knights of Columbus pamphlet rack at a nearby parish. There, and in a more intense document *Familiaris consortio*, he offers numerous suggestions as to how the parishes and dioceses ought to celebrate the family as Church and meet its specific needs, branching out from there to many of the other communities which make up the greater communion of Catholicism.

To do this requires that parishes and dioceses engage a lot more ministerial workers, both paid and volunteer, so that specific programs, liturgies and services are provided for each of the recognizable communities within the diocese or parish. John Paul believed that by undertaking what he realized was much greater and far more intense division of labor, the Church would more readily address the evangelism needed to effectively transform the world.

Pope Francis certainly understood that to accomplish any of this, the Church needed to broaden the horizons of just who could or would do what. That was the goal of his Synod on Synodality, developing ways and means of attracting the workers, paid and volunteer, training them and then releasing them to undertake the manifold works necessary to meet the specific needs of each and every community within the community of diocese or parish.

Check out that list of some of the celebrations on which the Jubilee year focuses. How well do you see the local church address those same communities. Are they distinct within the framework of ministry? If you don't see any of those communities, perhaps it's because we've failed to meet them where they are, to lead them ever more closely to the Kingdom of God represented in the active life of the parish and to invite them to an active role in leadership.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News for September 7, 2025

Think safety in fall as weather changes. Nights are getting cooler, and the trees are starting to change colors as autumn begins. And routines are changing because kids are back to school, the days are shorter and winter planning is underway. Think safety as you enjoy the cooler temperatures and vibrant colors. Get your flu shot. Protect yourself from influenza with a flu shot. The viruses found in the influenza vaccine are inactive, so you cannot get the flu from the vaccine. After getting vaccinated, it takes about two weeks to develop antibodies to protect against influenza. That's why getting vaccinated early in the fall is recommended. The vaccine usually is available in early to mid-fall.
