

Dear People of God,

Today the Universal Church celebrates the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. It's a day to consider not just the crucifixion, the single word that inspires thoughts of the death of Jesus on the cross; instead, it is a day to give thought to how the cross itself, once a symbol of tyranny and a horrible way to be executed, becomes, through Jesus' willingly enduring it, a symbol of life, salvation and the restoration of humanity to its original relationship to the creator God. Sadly, over the years there has been a blurring between the cross on its own and the event of the crucifixion. That ought not be the case; however, even on Good Friday when we are asked to "behold the wood of the Cross," we tend to venerate the Christ hung upon it but fail to make note of the transformation of an instrument of death to an instrument of life. Today's celebration should focus our attention on wood, not Jesus hanging on a particular device invented by humans to be humiliating, fear-filled and deadly yet which our loving God has made for us a symbol of salvation.

This weekend we also commemorate in prayer the terrorist attacks on New York and Washington and the unbelievably heroic prevention of an attack which ended in a Pennsylvania field. Great symbols of American triumph were either destroyed or damaged in those attacks, yet in their place we can see today powerful reminders that the sacrifice of those who died led to great accomplishments and a much safer environment for all.

Unfortunately, time tends to soften the impact of events like 9-11 and for many the terror, the fear and the recovery are all but forgotten. That's the human reality: we are meant to be in the present and carry with us only a fraction of our own past and even less of the past of others.

Possibly, that's why the church insists on maintaining its calendar of significant events and people in our own, long history as the Body of Christ. An awareness of history guarantees that what gave birth to our present won't be forgotten but might serve as an example for how we ought to relate to the world around us. For example, by recalling the events of 9-11, we can also pause to give thought and prayerful thanks to those who sacrificed everything for others. Perhaps their heroism might inspire us to that same level of love of neighbor so that, should we be called to make that same sacrifice, we will not hesitate to do so. May all who died in those horrific events and those who continue to give up their lives to the consequences of their participation rest in peace.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
