Dear people of God,

Further commentary on the Queen of Apostles pilgrimage to Italy invites focusing on the Holy Year of Hope declared by Pope Francis. Millions of people have made their way to Rome for the various events and celebrations; many more will be going. Among the goals of that pilgrimage is walking through one of the Holy Doors opened every twenty-five years; many know about the one at St. Peter's; however, there are three others at the major basilica churches: Mary Major, St. John the Evangelist and St. Paul Outside the Walls.

The crush of young people attempting to enter St. Peter's prevented our students from going through but they did make their way through the Byzantine Door at St. Paul Outside the Walls. This church is built on the site of the beheading of St. Paul by the Emperor's agent and the door is one of only a few structural elements of the basilica not destroyed in a fire in the nineteenth century.

The number of people at the basilica allowed our group to pose for a group photo before going into the church which is famous for the rondels of all the popes arrayed just under the ceiling. A spotlight is focused on the current Holy Father (a blank circle right now until the figure of Leo XIV can be created for installation) Many of our pilgrims wore the special t-shirts designed for Italy honoring Carlo Acutis. Although he is well-known, there were no many shirts venerating his memory and ministry so we all certainly stood out as we all ought to stand out as being part of the Body of Christ whether wearing a shirt that says so or not.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
