

Dear People of God,

Bishop Thomas recently issued a pastoral letter titled *The Body Reveals the Person: A Catholic Response to Gender Ideology.* You can find it on the home page of our diocesan web page. It's a thoroughgoing document which many will find informative and a valuable tool in understanding what has become a "hot button" issue in the world around us. I urge one and all to take a look.

Our contemporary culture has done a lot to blur the natural sense of human nature, erasing traditional social values and replacing them with the impersonal "social media" which does little to build any real society and breaks down the meaningful face-to-face communication which was once the standard for interpersonal relationships. Much of the difficulty arising from all of this is the tragic loss of a connection to God and for us Catholics, to Jesus the Christ.

From childhood most of my generation, and perhaps that just behind mine, was raised to understand that God is love. That created a deep sense that every loving relationship, be that with myself, my neighbor or with God, is a relationship derivative of, steeped in and opening me to sharing genuine love with others. I believe that the greatest wound to our cultural understanding of human nature is that many people, young and old, do not understand how to love themselves so cannot love others and in the end, cannot accept or return the life-giving love of God.

Why is there so much anger? Why are people in such as hurry to go nowhere important? Why are so many children suffering depression and gender confusion? Why do men and women lash out in random, senseless acts of violence? I would conclude that they don't love themselves as human persons and that sense of uselessness, confronting an interior inclination to be fully human, leads to radical anger, frustration and what we have tragically witnessed across the land far too often.

Issues of gender, of who one really is, are the outward manifestation of a grave interior hurt, one which can be healed by reviving a sense of closeness to God which illuminates the image and likeness of God in which any of us has been made; recognizing this enables us to love ourselves, leading in turn to loving, not hating or killing others, and to finding a place in which God's gentle whisper of love becomes a refreshing tide.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


