

Dear People of God,

Today we celebrate Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. Because it's the last Sunday in Ordinary Time or the end of the Church's liturgical year, we might see this feast day as the summit of our longing to be one with God.


I'm a big fan of outer space. My father had a huge collection of science fiction which I began reading about the age of six (my introduction to other genres of literature came at the command of a Sister when I turned in one too many book reviews based on that Sci-Fi collection). I attended college in Houston were I worked with and knew the first generation of NASA, including the graduate of St. John High School in Lima, Ohio, who "invented" the first space suit used by the famous "men on the moon." I follow the adventures of Martian exploration, the visions brought to us from the Webb and Hubble telescopes and am intrigued by the constant search for "life in the universe."

Why are we concerned about life elsewhere? I believe because we're aware of the vastness and nearly eternal nature of what's "out there." We really want to know if there's a way to beat the limited time we have and make our way anywhere else at all. I'm not too concerned because today's feast reminds me that Jesus, who walked this world long before we knew there were other worlds in other solar systems, is King of it all. In the promise of eternal life, I see the promise of finally having the time and ability to get "out there" and see first-hand the amazing reality of an entire universe in company with my King, Jesus.

Of course, for the Church, King of the Universe is a fundamental statement that the man who lived in ancient Galilee is, in fact, the God who created the universe, whose artistic hand drew the shapes and colors, the worlds and suns, the swirling galaxies and all that we have yet to see (look up Focusing the Webb telescope on YouTube and see what happens when the sixteen panels all align on a star so distant we can barely see it, even with a telescopeyou'll be amazed as was I watching it live). For Catholics, Jesus, King of the Universe, is the promise of resurrection, its fulfillment witnessed by his own rising from the Dead.

As we conclude this liturgical year, we are reminded that this coming Thursday is Thanksgiving. Let's all make it a day of giving thanks before we sit down to dinner or to watch football. All of us have much for which to be thankful so make a list and truly give thanks. Look for the schedule of Masses for this special day and stop in to give thanks to the King of the Universe from whom all those good things come.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


